OPEN FIRE REGULATIONS

CAMPFIRES, CATEGORY 2 FIRES AND CATEGORY 3 FIRES: WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE?



CAMPFIRE:

Any fire smaller than 0.5 metres high by 0.5 metres wide

REGULATIONS:



You must have ready access to 8 litres of water or a shovel for the entire time your campfire is lit.



Your campfire must be completely extinguished and the ashes must be cool to the touch before leaving the area for any length of time. (Hot coals can reignite the fire.)



During campfire prohibitions, only a CSA- or ULC-approved portable campfire apparatus may be used, and the flame height must not exceed 15 centimetres.



You must build a fire guard around your campfire.

CATEGORY 2 FIRE:

- 1 to 2 concurrently burning piles no larger than 2 metres high by 3 metres wide
- Stubble or grass burning over an area less than 0.2 hectares

REGULATIONS:



A fuel break must be established around any Category 2 burn



Fireworks are banned when a Category 2 fire prohibition is in effect. Burning barrels are banned when a Category 2 fire prohibition is in



At least one person equipped with a fire-fighting hand tool must monitor the fire at all times.

CATEGORY 3 FIRE:

- Any fire larger than 2 metres high by 3 metres wide
- 3 or more concurrently burning piles no larger than 2 metres high by 3 metres wide
- 1 or more burning windrows
- Stubble or grass burning over an area greater than 0.2 hectares

REGULATIONS:



A fuel break must be established around any Category 3 burn



Monitor your open burn to ensure that the fire doesn't spread beyond its intended size.



You must have a burn registration number to light a Category 3 open fire. Call the burn registration line 1 888 797-1717 to obtain one.

GENERAL REGULATIONS:



strong wind conditions.



Your fire must be extinguished before leaving the area.



Always keep your fire a safe distance away from nearby branches, wood and other combustible materials.



Do not conduct Category 2 or Category 3 burns when venting conditions are "Poor" or "Fair". Always check here first: www.bcairquality.ca/ readings/ventilation-index.html

ATTENTION HOME OWNERS

BASIC GRANT

Applicant under 65 years of age.

If the current year tax is less than \$1120, the basic N & R home owner grant is the amount of the current year taxes less \$350. If the current year tax is \$1120 or more, the basic N & R home owner grant is \$770. The minimum tax payment required from applicants under 65 is \$350.

ADDITIONAL GRANT

Applicant 65 years of age or older or in receipt of prescribed war veteransor disability allowances, or persons with disabilities as defined underthe regulations.

If the current year tax is less than \$1145, the basic

N & R home owner grant, inclusive of the additional grant, is the amount of the current year tax less \$100.

If the current year tax is \$1145 or more, the basic N & R home owner grant, inclusive of the additional grant is \$1045.

The minimum tax payment required from applicants under this heading is \$100.

Assessed values above \$1,625,000.

Above \$1,625,000 of residential assessed value, the grant will be reduced on a graduated scale. That is, the grant otherwise payable is to be reduced by \$5 for every \$1,000 of residential assessed value in excess of \$1,625,000.



Police Report: April 2022



Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to 27 calls for service between March 18th, 2022 to April 19th, 2022. 51 written violations and warning tickets were issued to drivers between the above dates for various motor vehicle related offences. Highway and road safety continues to be a focus for the Hudson's Hope RCMP.

Please make note of the numerous construction sites along Hwy 29 toward Fort St. John. Due to the increase of work sites along the highway, there is a large fluctuation between the speed zones for each site. Police will be monitoring these areas as they are a posted construction zone and fines will range from \$196.00 to \$253.00 for speeding violations within a marked construction zone.

Being that Spring is technically upon us again (even though it doesn't look like it currently), the Hudson's Hope RCMP would like to remind locals to be aware of the emerging bears from their long hibernations. Upon emerging from their long cozy earth dens, bears will be quite slow and groggy for several days, however, during this time, bears will be quite hungry and will be looking for easy meals, ie: left out garbage, compost piles, gardens, small pets, etc.

That said, if one is to become face to face with one of these furry creatures, please remember the following tips:

- The proof of the pro
- **Stay calm**, your calm behaviour can reassure the bear,
- Speak to the bear, talk calmly and firmly,
- Do not turn and run but rather back away slowly while facing the bear,
- Make yourself appear BIG, pick up small children and stay within a group (if with others),
- If have a backpack on, do not remove being that it can provide protection should the bear attack,
- If planning an outdoor excursion in bear country, make lots of noise, travel in groups if able to, and carry bear spray (always examine the expire date on the spray...could be a bad time to discover that your bear spray has expired and is no longer potent!), and lastly, if you have to use the bear spray, pay attention to the wind direction. Spraying yourself only makes it easier for the bear and now you have also seasoned yourself!

On March 31st, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a stolen ATCO trailer from a property on the South side of the Peace River. It was reported that an ATCO trailer had been stolen or taken without permission and currently has not been recovered. File remains open for investigation.

On April 6th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP stopped a motor vehicle for speeding through the school zone along Beattie Dr. Upon identifying the driver, it was found that the driver was not only speeding but did not have a valid drivers licence and was found to be breaching several court ordered conditions. The individual was arrested and later transported to a remand facility.

On April 7th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report that twenty-one (21) 9-1-1 calls had been made from a residence with no response on the line. Police attended the area and upon conducting checks, located the caller which turned out to be a young child playing with an old phone. For note, cell phones that have been deactivated or have had the SIM card removed, can still make emergency 9-1-1 calls if the emergency calling system have not been manually turned off within the phone settings.

On April 15th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of illegal dumping and trespassing at the Hudson's Hope garbage dump. It was found that during closed business hours, someone had trespassed and driven into the dump site via accessing a side road, and illegally dumped a full sized truck camper. Though the dumping of this item was at a designated dump, this item is too large to be processed without being dismantled accordingly. File remains open for ownership confirmation.

Tree Planting Rebate 2022

District of Hudson's Hope Tree Planting Rebate Program

NLY WHILE QUANTITIES LAST

All applicants are required to accept terms and conditions of the rebate program, which include:

- 1. Only trees purchased after January 1, 2022, and are identified as growing in Zone 1, 2 or 3 are eligible for rebate. Shrubs and flowers will not be eligible for this rebate. A limited number of rebates are available on a first-come, first-serve basis.
- 2. Each rebate is a maximum of \$50. If the price is below \$50, the rebated amount will be the actual purchase price. The subsidy will be issued in the form of a cheque payable to the purchaser.
- 3. Only one rebate per year per property will be issued.
- 4. To be eligible you must have a District of Hudson's Hope property tax account in your name, a completed rebate form, original purchase receipt (photocopies not accepted), and the tree tag indicating growing zone 1, 2 or 3.

- 5. Trees are to be planted at the address associated with the property tax account. Trees are not to be planted on public property, right of way or easement.
- 6. The District of Hudson's Hope accepts no responsibility for loss, damages or claims to property caused by or resulting from Community Tree Planting Rebate Policy.
- 7.The District of Hudson's Hope reserves the right to reverse the rebate if information provided on the application form is either incorrect or untrue, or if the terms and conditions have been breached.
- 8. The District of Hudson's Hope reserves the right to alter, cancel or discontinue the program at any time.



Homeowner Information to Building Permits

The District of Hudson's Hope wants to assist homeowners and contractors to avoid unnecessary delays and expense in planning and construction of residential projects. Below explains when permits are required, requirements for the permit, possible other documents that may be required and other information to assist you in obtaining your building permit. Additional information is available at the District Office or online at www.hudsonshope.ca

A BUILDING PERMIT IS REQUIRED TO:

- construct a new home;
- •locate mobile / modular home;
- construct a commercial, industrial or public use building;
- •construct a new accessory building e.g., carport, farm building, garage or storage shed;
- renovate existing buildings;
- •undertake any structural work such as interior partitions;
- enclose a porch or roof over a sundeck;
- move or demolish a building;
- •re-roof a building;
- •reconstruct after damage;
- plumbing system changes;

INFORMATION TO BE SUBMITTED WITH A BUILDING PERMIT APPLICATION

The following items must be supplied along with a completed Building Permit Application before a Building Permit can be issued. A Building Permit fee is based on the value of the building or structure and will be calculated by the Building Official.


1. BUILDING PLANS


Two sets of detailed building plans. If you cannot draw the necessary building or site plans, then you should obtain the services of a qualified person.

Example Floor Plans

- scale not less than 1:50 metric (1/4 inch to 1 foot);
- size and location of windows and doors;
- location of all plumbing fixtures;
- location of all mechanical equipment.

- all rooms, size and use of each;
- all dimensions;
- finished and unfinished areas; -





2. SITE PLAN

- full legal description of lot: lot number, plan number; district lot number (from your tax notice or Title);
- lot dimensions:
- adjoining street names;
- locations and uses of existing and proposed buildings or additions;
- distances from all property lines for existing and proposed buildings or additions;
- location of legal road access to the property;
- size, location and number of parking spaces;
- existing and proposed wells or other water sources;
- location of existing or proposed sewage disposal fields on property;
- location of any watercourses on property showing distances from existing or proposed buildings or additions;

This information is intended to assist the general public in applying for a Building Permit within the District of Hudson's Hope.

BUILDING INSPECTIONS (Typical)

The Building Bylaw requires inspections at the following stages of construction;

- Footings prior to pouring concrete.
- Backfilling after completion of damp-proofing, drain tile, and drain rock (if required), but prior to backfilling.
- Plumbing before any part of the plumbing system is covered.
- Framing after the entire rough-in plumbing, electrical and mechanical equipment is installed and the framing is completed to lockup stage, but prior to insulating.
- Insulation and Vapour Barrier after all insulation and vapour barriers are installed, but prior to covering.
- Final when the building or portion thereof is completed and ready for occupancy, but prior to occupancy thereof.

An Occupancy Certificate is required prior to occupancy of a building. In order for an Occupancy Certificate to be issued, all inspections above must be approved.



RECYCLING CARTONS AND PAPER CUPS

Paper packaging is recycled into new boxes, paper towels, tissues, paper-based plant pots, the paper cover for drywall liner, Kraft paper, brown paper products including paper towels.

Accepted Materials

- Paper cups for hot and cold beverages
- Cartons and boxes for milk, milk-type beverages, cream, substitute eggs, broth, sauces, etc.
- Frozen dessert boxes for ice cream, frozen yogurt, etc.
