

# **Boater safety on the Peace River**

We're reminding boaters that the section of the Peace River around the Site C dam site, upstream of the construction bridge, is permanently closed to boaters. Boaters are urged to stay away from the area. Please adhere to the signage posted both upstream and downstream of the closure.

# ATTENTION HOME OWNERS

#### **BASIC GRANT**

#### Applicant under 65 years of age.

If the current year tax is less than \$1120, the basic N & R home owner grant is the amount of the current year taxes less \$350. If the current year tax is \$1120 or more, the basic N & R home owner grant is \$770. The minimum tax payment required from applicants under 65 is \$350.

#### **ADDITIONAL GRANT**

Applicant 65 years of age or older or in receipt of prescribed war veteransor disability allowances, or persons with disabilities as defined underthe regulations.

If the current year tax is less than \$1145, the basic

N & R home owner grant, inclusive of the additional grant, is the amount of the current year tax less

If the current year tax is \$1145 or more, the basic N & R home owner grant, inclusive of the additional grant is \$1045.

The minimum tax payment required from applicants under this heading is \$100.

#### Assessed values above \$1,625,000.

Above \$1,625,000 of residential assessed value, the grant will be reduced on a graduated scale. That is, the grant otherwise payable is to be reduced by \$5 for every \$1,000 of residential assessed value in excess of \$1,625,000.

# Tree Planting Rebate 2022

District of Hudson's Hope Tree Planting Rebate Program

# **VLY WHILE QUANTITIES LAST**

All applicants are required to accept terms and conditions of the rebate program, which include:

- 1. Only trees purchased after January 1, 2022, and are identified as growing in Zone 1, 2 or 3 are eligible for rebate. Shrubs and flowers will not be eligible for this rebate. A limited number of rebates are available on a first-come, first-serve basis.
- 2. Each rebate is a maximum of \$50. If the price is below \$50, the rebated amount will be the actual purchase price. The subsidy will be issued in the form of a cheque payable to the purchaser.
- 3. Only one rebate per year per property will be issued.
- 4. To be eligible you must have a District of Hudson's Hope property tax account in your name, a completed rebate form, original purchase receipt (photocopies not accepted), and the tree tag indicating growing zone 1, 2 or 3.

- 5. Trees are to be planted at the address associated with the property tax account. Trees are not to be planted on public property, right of way or easement.
  - 6. The District of Hudson's Hope accepts no responsibility for loss, damages or claims to property caused by or resulting from Community Tree Planting Rebate Policy.
- 7.The District of Hudson's Hope reserves the right to reverse the rebate if information provided on the application form is either incorrect or untrue, or if the terms and conditions have been breached.
- 8. The District of Hudson's Hope reserves the right to alter, cancel or discontinue the program at any time.

Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to 23 calls for service between April 19<sup>th</sup>, 2022 to May 20<sup>th</sup>, 2022. 36 written violations and warning tickets were issued to drivers between the above dates for various motor vehicle related offences. Highway and road safety continues to be a focus for the Hudson's Hope RCMP.

Please make note of the numerous construction sites along Hwy 29 toward Fort St. John. Due to the increase of work sites along the highway, there is a large fluctuation between the speed zones for each site. Police will be monitoring these areas as they are a posted construction zone and fines will range from \$196.00 to \$253.00 for speeding violations within a marked construction zone.

With Spring now upon us, we will see an increase in the use of off-road vehicles (ORV's) on the back roads and trails in our areas. That said, the Hudson's Hope RCMP want to remind drivers and riders to use caution on the trails and roads amongst the Crown land areas being that more hikers and persons on horseback (best practice and common decency to slow down when passing those on horseback) will be frequenting these trails. It is advised for those whom operate any ORV to review the Off-Road Vehicle Act which can be found on the ICBC website.

Secondary, we would like to remind those who operate off-road vehicles on Crown land, that all ORV's must be registered and clearly display their ICBC number plates. Some of the more common ORV offences observed by police include the follow:

- operating an ORV on Crown land without registration, comes with a fine of \$230,
- failure to display number plate, comes with a fine of \$173,
- careless operation of an ORV or damage to property,
- comes with a fine of \$368,
- no approved safety helmet, comes with a fine of \$138.

## ORV's include the following:

- snowmobiles,
- off-road motorcycles,
- side by sides (e.g. "argos, rhinos, and razors"),
- Jeeps, trucks, SUV's and other small on-highway motor vehicles.



On April 22<sup>nd</sup>, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of gun shots heard during the evening within the residential area of Beryl Prairie. Upon investigation, police spoke with the persons believed to be involved and no charges were sought. As a reminder, it is unlawful to hunt or discharge a firearm within 100m of a church, school building/yard, playground, regional district park, dwelling house, or farm or ranch building that is occupied by persons or domestic animals. An owner or occupier of land, or an employee of an owner or occupier are exempted near a dwelling house or farm or ranch building that is occupied by persons or domestic animals, for the purpose of slaughtering livestock.

On May 4<sup>th</sup>, the Hudson's Hope RCMP, along with the handsome Hudson's Hope Fire Chief, conducted a joint traffic check-stop along Beattie Dr. where members of both organizations spoke with several drivers about Emergency Preparedness as this was emergency preparedness week with the fire/flood season soon kicking off.

On May 4<sup>th</sup>, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received another report of shots heard near the Coulson Rd. area of Beryl Prairie. Police attended the area and conducted patrols but were unable to locate any individuals directly involved in the offence.

On May 5<sup>th</sup>, the Hudson's Hope RCMP stopped a vehicle along Hwy 29 which had been observed swerving between lanes. Upon the investigation, the driver was found to be under the influence of alcohol and therefore charged with impaired driving, resulting in the vehicle and trailer being towed/impounded.

On May 10<sup>th</sup>, the Hudson's Hope RCMP conducted boat patrols on Dinosaur Lake where several boaters were checked for compliance with the Small Vessel Regulations (SVR), Competency of Operators of Pleasure Craft Regulations (COPCR), and the Canada Shipping Act (CSA), with no infractions found.

On May 14<sup>th</sup>, the Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to a single motor vehicle accident along Dudley Dr. where a single vehicle was found on its side. Upon the investigation, it was found that the driver was not injured but was under the influence of alcohol, therefore the driver was charged for impaired driving and the vehicle was towed and impounded.

On May 16<sup>th</sup>, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received several phone calls regarding a hit and run at the intersection of Canyon Dr. and Beattie Dr. Upon investigation, it was found that a truck travelling at a high rate of speed toward the intersection was unable to navigate the corner due to the speed, and collided with a

Westbound car. The driver of the truck did not stop and fled from the scene. The truck was later located and the driver was arrested and charged for Dangerous Operation of a Motor Vehicle, Failure to Remain at the Scene of an Accident, and Driving while Impaired. File remains open for investigation.

On May 17<sup>th</sup>, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a break and enter with theft from a shop located in Lynx Creek. It was found that someone had broken into the building and stolen several items/tools that included: a welder, sledge hammer, several bars, and a bench vice. File remains open for investigation.

On May 20<sup>th</sup>, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of several off-road vehicles (ORV's) driving through the Dinosaur Lake campground area at high rates of speed. Police attended the area and upon conducting patrols, located several ORV's and upon speaking with the operators, police issued verbal warnings. # Homeowner Information to Building Permits

The District of Hudson's Hope wants to assist homeowners and contractors to avoid unnecessary delays and expense in planning and construction of residential projects. Below explains when permits are required, requirements for the permit, possible other documents that may be required and other information to assist you in obtaining your building permit. Additional information is available at the District Office or online at www.hudsonshope.ca

#### A BUILDING PERMIT IS REQUIRED TO:

- construct a new home;
- · locate mobile / modular home;
- construct a commercial, industrial or public use building;
- construct a new accessory building e.g., carport, farm building, garage or storage shed;
- renovate existing buildings;
- undertake any structural work such as interior partitions;
- enclose a porch or roof over a sundeck;
- move or demolish a building;
- re-roof a building;
- reconstruct after damage;
- plumbing system changes;

#### INFORMATION TO BE SUBMITTED WITH A BUILDING PERMIT APPLICATION

The following items must be supplied along with a completed Building Permit Application before a Building Permit can be issued. A Building Permit fee is based on the value of the building or structure and will be calculated by the Building Official.


#### 1. BUILDING PLANS


Two sets of detailed building plans. If you cannot draw the necessary building or site plans, then you should obtain the services of a qualified person.

#### **Example Floor Plans**

- scale not less than 1:50 metric (1/4 inch to 1 foot);
- size and location of windows and doors;
- location of all plumbing fixtures;
- location of all mechanical equipment.

- all rooms, size and use of each;
- all dimensions;
- finished and unfinished areas; —





#### 2. SITE PLAN

- full legal description of lot: lot number, plan number; district lot number (from your tax notice or Title);
- lot dimensions:
- adjoining street names;
- locations and uses of existing and proposed buildings or additions;
- distances from all property lines for existing and proposed buildings or additions;
- location of legal road access to the property;
- size, location and number of parking spaces;
- existing and proposed wells or other water sources;
- location of existing or proposed sewage disposal fields on property;
- location of any watercourses on property showing distances from existing or proposed buildings or additions;

# This information is intended to assist the general public in applying for a Building Permit within the District of Hudson's Hope.

# DRIVEWAY CROSSING EXISTING BUILDING ADDITION SUNDECK SEPTIC LANE SCALE:

#### **BUILDING INSPECTIONS (Typical)**

The Building Bylaw requires inspections at the following stages of construction;

- Footings prior to pouring concrete.
- Backfilling after completion of damp-proofing, drain tile, and drain rock (if required), but prior to backfilling.
- Plumbing before any part of the plumbing system is covered.
- Framing after the entire rough-in plumbing, electrical and mechanical equipment is installed and the framing is completed to lockup stage, but prior to insulating.
- Insulation and Vapour Barrier after all insulation and vapour barriers are installed, but prior to covering.
- Final when the building or portion thereof is completed and ready for occupancy, but prior to occupancy thereof.

An Occupancy Certificate is required prior to occupancy of a building. In order for an Occupancy Certificate to be issued, all inspections above must be approved.







Red Clocks by Leni Zumas creates a world where abortion, fertility treatments and adoption are federally restricted and follows a number of characters through their life impacts from these restrictions, and will trigger conversations about grief & loss and motherhood. "The sea does not ask permission or wait for instruction. It doesn't suffer from not knowing what on earth, exactly, it is meant to do."

This Close to Okay by Leesa Cross-Smith addresses mental health from someone on the precipice of suicide as well as a practitioner trying to offer aid, speaking about coping mechanisms and support systems. "You're human, and you have to reconcile that with yourself somehow. Forgive yourself. Allow yourself to feel everything deeply, to grow and learn."

If this club is successful, we may put more titles on hold and continue for the remainder of summer! You are more than welcome to put together a group of friends to set up a full private group, with a Library Leader, or not! We just need to know you are a group so that we can manage the loans effectively.

# **PROTECTIVE SERVICES**

Drowning is a leading cause of preventable injury and death in children under 10 in Canada. Sixty per cent of drownings occur in the four summer months from May to August, according to the Canadian Red Cross.

For parents and caregivers of children, part of the problem could be perceptual. In our popular imagination, drowning involves a protracted commotion: thrashing, gasping and cries for help. But when a drowning occurs in real life, it often happens swiftly and silently.

The difference between our ideas about drowning and the reality of it can give us a false sense of security. Parents and caregivers can help to prevent drownings by taking a few basic precautions:


**ACTIVELY SUPERVISE CHILDREN** when they are in or around water. For children under five and weak swimmers, active supervision means staying close -- within arm's reach. The Canadian Lifesaving Society recommends a supervision ratio of at least one adult for every baby, and one adult for every two small children. With older children, including good swimmers, it is still important to watch closely. Do not rely on a "buddy system" to keep kids safe, or make older children responsible for younger ones.

For extra protection, especially if you are watching more than one child, have children under five and weak swimmers WEAR LIFE JACKETS when playing in and around water. While boating, always wear your own lifejacket and ensure children are outfitted with lifejackets that fit them properly.

LEARN FIRST AID AND CPR (cardiopulmonary resuscitation). It doesn't take long to get trained in these lifesaving skills. Many people have been saved from drowning by bystanders who knew how to properly administer First Aid and CPR.

Put your kids in SWIMMING LESSONS. Although formal swimming lessons can't "drown-proof" children, some studies show kids who receive swim training are less likely to drown. If your own swimming abilities could use some work, consider enrolling in adult learn-to-swim or swim improvement class. Some courses, like the Lifesaving Society's Swim to Survive program, focus on water survival skills.

FENCE IT: if you have a backyard pool (including above-ground pool or temporary pool that will not be emptied after each use), or if you have a spa or hot tub, the best practice is to fence it off completely on all four sides. The fence should be at least four-feet high, with no gaps larger than four-inches. Access should be restricted by a latching, self-closing gate. It may be useful to keep in mind that chain link fences may be easier for children to scale than a fence made of vertical metal bars. Regardless of the fence style, four sided "isolation" fencing is more effective than three-sided "perimeter" fencing where the house is used as the fourth side.




