# Police Report: June/July 2022



Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to 43 calls for service between June 17<sup>th</sup> to July 18<sup>th</sup>, 2022. 38 written violations and warning tickets were issued to drivers between the above dates for various motor vehicle related offences. Highway and road safety continues to be a focus for the Hudson's Hope RCMP, along with the recent spike in property crime.

Please make note of the numerous construction sites along Hwy 29, between Hudson's Hope and Fort St. John. Due to the increase of work sites along the highway, there is a large fluctuation between the speed zones for each site. Police will be monitoring these areas as they are a posted construction zone and fines will range from \$196.00 to \$253.00 for speeding violations within a marked construction zone.

Also, we would like to remind drivers to please be patient when it comes to the traffic halts and one-way traffic flows along Hwy 29. We are aware that these can be frustrating at times but please do not take your frustrations out on the flaggers and workers...tantrums do not work! Speaking of tantrums, if anyone observed a dark coloured VW type car at the Farrell Creek construction site on July 17<sup>th</sup>, in which the driver exited their vehicle and began to throw traffic cones around and yell at the flagger, and happen to have a plate number or dash cam/video footage, please let us know!

On June 22<sup>nd</sup>, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of an Interac E-transfer fraud in which an individual responded to a Facebook page for some livestock for sale. Based on the mutual agreement, monies were transferred to the seller via E-transfer but upon trying to arrange pick-up of the payed for livestock, the seller no longer responded and evaded the buyer. Upon investigation, it was found that this seller had several other similar fraudulent posts for livestock for sale on other social media pages. This file remains open for further investigation.

On June 26<sup>th</sup>, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a break and enter that had occurred at a work site along Farrell Creek Rd. It was reported that someone(s) had pried the door open of a storage building and stole approximately 2000L of fuel, 30 pairs of protective glasses, 3 Kenwood handheld VHF radios, assorted tools including a Stihl culvert saw, and spill gear.

On June 26<sup>th</sup>, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report for a suspicious person wearing a hooded black sweater who was observed trespassing at a work site and whom was believed to be scoping out a beached pontoon boat located at this work site. Police attended the area but found that the suspect had vacated the area prior to police arrival.

On July 2<sup>nd</sup>, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of gun shots coming from the area at the end of Drew Rd. It was reported that approximately 25+ guns shots had been heard over a short period of time and that these shots were frightening the cattle and livestock nearby. It was advised that this has been an on-going problematic issue for the nearby residents. File remains open for continual investigation and monitoring.

On July 7<sup>th</sup>, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a theft of approximately 5000L of fuel from the Lynx Creek construction site. It was reported that sometime during the night,

someone(s) trespassed into the work site and helped themselves to the fuel which was being held in two large fuel tanks. File remains open for investigation.

On July 12<sup>th</sup>, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a theft of a skidsteer and a break and enter/theft from a storage container located at a work site along the Peace Canyon Rd. Upon attending the site, police were able to follow fresh tracks through the bush and located the stolen skidsteer which had been stashed in the bush. Items stolen from the storage container included a Stihl chainsaw, Stihl cut-off saw, and a Dewalt shop-vac. File remains open for further investigation.

On July 14<sup>th</sup>, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a break and enter to the Dawson Road Maintenance yard in which someone(s) attempted but were unsuccessful in stealing a Ford F350 truck. File remains open for further investigation.

On July 16<sup>th</sup>, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a break and enter/theft from the District of Hudson's Hope works yard. It was reported that someone(s) had cut the lock off the gate and stole several jerry cans, a tidy tank, several litres of fuel, and a 2010 Chevrolet Silverado truck. Upon investigation of the site, it was also found that a fire department trailer had also been broken into and several more jerry cans and a water pump had been stolen. These being items that assist and aid the local fire department in responding to and dealing with fires in our local area.


On July 18<sup>th</sup>, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a break and enter/theft from a property in the 19000 block of Hwy 29. It was reported that sometime within the past week, someone(s) had stolen the actual locked gate to the property, allowing them access to the property where several tools including an oxygen/acetylene torch set were stolen.

As you may have noticed from the above read, property crime has spiked yet again in our local community. These are all incidents that effect everyone who resides in our local area and can impact property owners both financially and mentally in a very negative manner. The RCMP wants to advise the public of the above events and advises to conduct checks throughout your properties occasionally to check for security of your property and possessions and also to make sure gates, doors, vehicles, etc are locked when not in use. Also, the use of cameras and or trail cams can be a big asset when it comes to incidents like this, for both the property owner and for the police.

If anyone observes any suspicious persons or vehicles in the area, please contact the local RCMP immediately. We do not recommend attempting to approach or deal with persons observed trespassing on your own, however, if one can obtain a person's description or a vehicle make/model and licence plate, these are all important pieces of evidence that can assist in identifying and arresting those responsible.

# Homeowner Information to Building Permits

The District of Hudson's Hope wants to assist homeowners and contractors to avoid unnecessary delays and expense in planning and construction of residential projects. Below explains when permits are required, requirements for the permit, possible other documents that may be required and other information to assist you in obtaining your building permit. Additional information is available at the District Office or online at www.hudsonshope.ca

#### A BUILDING PERMIT IS REQUIRED TO:

- construct a new home;
- locate mobile / modular home;
- construct a commercial, industrial or public use building;
- construct a new accessory building e.g., carport, farm building, garage or storage shed;
- renovate existing buildings;
- undertake any structural work such as interior partitions;
- enclose a porch or roof over a sundeck;
- move or demolish a building;
- re-roof a building;
- · reconstruct after damage;
- · plumbing system changes;

#### INFORMATION TO BE SUBMITTED WITH A BUILDING PERMIT APPLICATION

The following items must be supplied along with a completed Building Permit Application before a Building Permit can be issued. A Building Permit fee is based on the value of the building or structure and will be calculated by the Building Official.


#### 1. BUILDING PLANS


Two sets of detailed building plans. If you cannot draw the necessary building or site plans, then you should obtain the services of a qualified person.

### **Example Floor Plans**

- scale not less than 1:50 metric (1/4 inch to 1 foot);
- size and location of windows and doors;
- location of all plumbing fixtures;
- location of all mechanical equipment.

- all rooms, size and use of each;
- all dimensions;
- finished and unfinished areas; —





#### 2. SITE PLAN

- full legal description of lot: lot number, plan number; district lot number (from your tax notice or Title);
- lot dimensions:
- adjoining street names;
- locations and uses of existing and proposed buildings or additions;
- distances from all property lines for existing and proposed buildings or additions;
- location of legal road access to the property;
- size, location and number of parking spaces;
- existing and proposed wells or other water sources;
- location of existing or proposed sewage disposal fields on property;
- location of any watercourses on property showing distances from existing or proposed buildings or additions;

# This information is intended to assist the general public in applying for a Building Permit within the District of Hudson's Hope.

# DRIVEWAY CROSSING EXISTING BUILDING BUILDING SUNDECK SCALE: SCALE:

#### **BUILDING INSPECTIONS (Typical)**

The Building Bylaw requires inspections at the following stages of construction;

- Footings prior to pouring concrete.
- Backfilling after completion of damp-proofing, drain tile, and drain rock (if required), but prior to backfilling.
- Plumbing before any part of the plumbing system is covered.
- Framing after the entire rough-in plumbing, electrical and mechanical equipment is installed and the framing is completed to lockup stage, but prior to insulating.
- Insulation and Vapour Barrier after all insulation and vapour barriers are installed, but prior to covering.
- Final when the building or portion thereof is completed and ready for occupancy, but prior to occupancy thereof.

An Occupancy Certificate is required prior to occupancy of a building. In order for an Occupancy Certificate to be issued, all inspections above must be approved.



# Welcome to the Hudson's Hope Museum

# "Garbitt"

It was 1888 when a young Scotsman from Aberdeen by the name of "Harry Garbitt" came to Canada. While in Edmonton he was hired on to move horses North, passing through Fort St. John in 1895 and continuing north. In Fort Nelson they purchased dogs and continued North for a ways. Harry & his partner, Cayuse Graham stayed with the Indians for the next 2 winters: trapping and learning the "wilds".

They then headed west, crossing the Rockies to the Finlay River then on down the Finlay & Peace Rivers past Hudson's Hope. Harry went to work for the Hudson's Bay Company in Al-

berta before returning to work for Revillion Freres in Fort St. John in 1910. Then onto Hudson's Hope with the Hudson's Bay Company in 1912 where he took up quarter section of land, freighting & trapping for several years. He then moved on to Moberly Lake where he married Martha Desjarlais. Martha was a baby when she came to Moberly Lake with her family. A member of the Saulteau Tribe. They went on to have 3 children: Pat, MaryAnn, and Gertrude.

Harry opened a little trading post at Moberly Lake and administered to the Indians. He was their doctor, advisor, and settler of disputes.

When mail service was inaugurated between Hudson's Hope and Moberly Lake Harry was the mail carrier. Either by packhorse or team & sleigh or wagon. When automobiles came along Harry retired from carrying the mail.

Harry remained at Moberly Lake enjoying life to the end at a ripe old age.





**Provincial Grant:** This spring we were awarded a provincial grant for \$26797.75 from the BC Government. This grant is for COVID-19 relief and recovery as well as emergency preparedness. With these funds we are allocating a portion to supplement our employees with addition hours for updating emergency policies and to do the work required of this project plan, as well as the expenses that the library layout project will incur. Additional funds will be used to update our staff computers, transitioning our work stations to laptop with desktop docking capability to make any work-from-home transitioning much more seamless.

# Tips to Stay Safe While Boating

With the four tips below, individuals who are boating can stay safe and ensure that each experience out on the water is rewarding and free of potential emergencies.

- 1. The importance of lifejackets: The most essential thing that individuals need when they're out on the water is a lifejacket or personal flotation device (PFD), as this can substantially reduce the potential for drowning or other dangerous aquatic incidents.
- **2. Avoid alcohol**: According to the Canadian Red Cross, 37 per cent of boaters in Canada consume alcohol each time they are on the water, while alcohol has been linked as a factor in more than 40 percent of deaths in recreational boating incidents. Beer, liquor and wine can negatively impact a boater's judgment and make him or her less likely to maintain control of core motor functions compared to individuals who do not drink on the water, which underscores the importance of being sober while boating.
- **3. Pay attention to weather conditions**: While weather conditions may not seem as essential as wearing a lifejacket or PFD, understanding what the climate and forecast will be like during an upcoming boating experience can be crucial for staying safe while aboard a vessel.
- **4. Bringing safety gear on board**: From marine first aid kits to sunscreen, drinking water, flashlights, sound signaling devices and manual propelling devices, there are a variety of safety devices that should be brought on a boat in order to reduce the likelihood of emergencies.




