






Police Report: July/August 2022



Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to 36 calls for service between July 18th to August 16th, 2022. 45 written violations and warning tickets were issued to drivers between the above dates for various motor vehicle related offences. Highway and road safety continues to be a focus for the Hudson's Hope RCMP.

Please make note of the numerous construction sites along Hwy 29, between Hudson's Hope and Fort St. John. Due to the increase of work sites along the highway, there is a large fluctuation between the speed zones for each site. Police will be monitoring these areas as they are a posted construction zone and fines will range from \$196.00 to \$253.00 for speeding violations within a marked construction zone.

On July 19th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to a report of a single commercial vehicle accident along the Farrell Creek Rd. Police attended scene with Fire and BCEHS and found that a commercial truck and trailer had driven off the main road into the side ditch. The driver of the truck incurred non-life threatening injuries and was transported to hospital. The cause of the accident is still under investigation but vehicle malfunction is believed to be a factor in the accident.

On July 28th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a missing person from a residence along the Farrell Creek Rd. The circumstances surrounding the missing person was deemed abnormal but with the assistance of Search & Rescue utilizing a helicopter, RCMP, and the family, the missing person was later located and in good health.

On July 30th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP stopped a motorist along Hwy 29 after it was found to be travelling at a rate of speed that was 55km/hr over the posted speed limit. The driver received an Excessive Speed charge with a fine of \$368.00 with the vehicle being towed and impounded for 7 days.

On August 1st, the Hudson's Hope RCMP joined forces with local Conservation Officers to conduct a check-stop along Canyon Drive. From the check-stop, approximately 225 vehicles were stopped with several offences found that included the seizure of approximately 10 illegally possessed fish from nearby water sources. Several violation tickets were issued to drivers for various offences that included Motor Vehicle Act and Wildlife Act infractions.

On August 7th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a loose dog at a local business which was observed barking and growling at people passing by. Police arrived on scene and observed the large dog barking and growling at persons walking in and out of the business. While trying to get the canine to vacate the area, the RCMP member was bitten by this dog. Local Animal control was contacted and bylaw tickets were issued to the owner. This is a reminder that as per the Hudson's Hope Bylaws, all dogs must be on leash and controlled when out in public areas.


On August 9th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP stopped a motorist along Hwy 29 after it was observed travelling at a rate of speed that was 50km/hr over the posted speed limit through a construction zone. The driver received an Excessive Speed charge with a fine of \$368.00 with the vehicle being towed and impounded for 7 days.

On August 16th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a missing/ abandoned person along the Kobes Creek Forestry Rd. It was reported that a non-local tree planter had gotten left behind by crews at the end of the day and had no means of communication minus being able to utilize the emergency 911 function on their cell phone. Police were later updated that the company realized that they were short a crew member and returned to their staging area and located the frightened and lone individual.

It is that time of the year again in which the furry Ursus Americanus (bears) critters start to venture closer to town in search of the abundant fruit trees and wild Saskatoon berries that grow all over our town. As a reminder, if you have fruit trees and berry bushes on your property, it is advised to try and pick them as soon as possible so not to present an appetizing meal that will attract these furry and often grumpy critters. That said, if you observe a bear on your property, DO NOT approach or try and take a selfie with said wild and unpredictable animal (no matter how cute and cuddly you believe it to be!). If the bear is not leaving or is encroaching too close to your residence, contact the local RCMP or Conservation and they can deal with the bear accordingly.

Give yourself time to totally clear all your vehicle windows of frost and dew so that you can safely reach your destination. Violators could face fines such as:

Speed in School/playground zone

•Exceeded by less than 21km/hr: \$196 / 3 pts


•Exceeded by more than 21km/hr: \$253 / 3 pts

•Fail to stop for school bus: \$368 / 3 pts

•Fail to Yield to Pedestrian (crosswalk): \$167 / 3pts

•Windshield or window that impairs driver vision: \$81

QUALIFICATIONS FOR OFFICE

A person is qualified to be nominated, elected, and to hold office as a member of local government if they meet the following criteria:

- Canadian Citizen
- 18 years of age or older on the general voting day, October 15, 2022
- Resident of British Columbia for at least six (6) months immediately before the day nomination papers are filed; and
- Not disqualified by the Local Government Act or any other enactment from being nominated for, being elected to or holding the office or be otherwise disqualified by law.

CAMPAIGN PERIOD EXPENSE LIMITS

In accordance with the *Local Elections Campaign Financing Act* for the 2022 general local government election, the expense limit for candidates during the campaign period is as follows:

- Mayor \$10,797.83
- Councillor \$5,398.92

THIRD PARTY ADVERTISING LIMITS

In accordance with the *Local Elections Campaign Financing Act* for the 2022 general local government elections, the third party directed advertising limit applicable is \$809.84, and the cumulative third party directed and issue advertising limit in all BC local government election areas is \$161,967.47.

This portion of the work should not impact availability of our collections.

As this is being written, we are still making plans for further spending in accordance with our annual capital budget, which may include a new printer, programming tables and an additional amount of funds set aside specifically for this layout project.

Provincial Grant: As mentioned in last month's Bulletin, we were awarded a provincial grant for \$26797.75 from the Ministry of Municipal Affairs. This grant is for COVID-19 relief and recovery as well as emergency preparedness. We allocated approximately \$18,500 for the layout project, including the partitions, extra staff hours to carry-out the project, as well as additional furniture and shelving upgrades. A further \$4400 has been used for updating two of our staff computers to laptops with docking stations, and the final \$3900 will supplement our staff wages through 2023 to support emergency planning and preparedness policy updates.

Library Programs: We require that all children and youth attending our programs be preregistered, with the exception of teens who may self-register. Please pay attention to PSAs and our Facebook page for program updates, if any changes or cancellations need to be made, we will announce them on those platforms.





Homeowner Information to Building Permits

The District of Hudson's Hope wants to assist homeowners and contractors to avoid unnecessary delays and expense in planning and construction of residential projects. Below explains when permits are required, requirements for the permit, possible other documents that may be required and other information to assist you in obtaining your building permit. Additional information is available at the District Office or online at www.hudsonshope.ca

A BUILDING PERMIT IS REQUIRED TO:

- → construct a new home;
- → locate mobile / modular home;
- construct a commercial, industrial or public use building;
- construct a new accessory building e.g., carport, farm building, garage or storage shed;
- renovate existing buildings;
- undertake any structural work such as interior partitions;
- enclose a porch or roof over a sundeck;
- move or demolish a building;
- → re-roof a building;
- → reconstruct after damage;
- plumbing system changes;

INFORMATION TO BE SUBMITTED WITH A BUILDING PERMIT APPLICATION

The following items must be supplied along with a completed Building Permit Application before a Building Permit can be issued. A Building Permit fee is based on the value of the building or structure and will be calculated by the Building Official.


1. BUILDING PLANS


Two sets of detailed building plans. If you cannot draw the necessary building or site plans, then you should obtain the services of a qualified person.

Example Floor Plans

- scale not less than 1:50 metric (1/4 inch to 1 foot);
- size and location of windows and doors;
- location of all plumbing fixtures;
- location of all mechanical equipment.

- all rooms, size and use of each;
- all dimensions;
- finished and unfinished areas; —





2. SITE PLAN

- full legal description of lot: lot number, plan number; district lot number (from your tax notice or Title);
- lot dimensions;
- adjoining street names;
- locations and uses of existing and proposed buildings or additions;
- distances from all property lines for existing and proposed buildings or additions;
- location of legal road access to the property;
- size, location and number of parking spaces;
- existing and proposed wells or other water sources;
- location of existing or proposed sewage disposal fields on property;
- location of any watercourses on property showing distances from existing or proposed buildings or additions;

This information is intended to assist the general public in applying for a Building Permit within the District of Hudson's Hope.

BUILDING INSPECTIONS (Typical)

The Building Bylaw requires inspections at the following stages of construction;

- Footings prior to pouring concrete.
- Backfilling after completion of damp-proofing, drain tile, and drain rock (if required), but prior to backfilling.
- Plumbing before any part of the plumbing system is covered.
- Framing after the entire rough-in plumbing, electrical and mechanical equipment is installed and the framing is completed to lockup stage, but prior to insulating.
- Insulation and Vapour Barrier after all insulation and vapour barriers are installed, but prior to covering.
- Final when the building or portion thereof is completed and ready for occupancy, but prior to occupancy thereof.

An Occupancy Certificate is required prior to occupancy of a building. In order for an Occupancy Certificate to be issued, all inspections above must be approved.

Listen. Put away the electronic gadgets, cell phones and ear buds so you can hear approaching traffic that may be



Quiz time. Make a fun, interactive game out of guessing the correct traffic signs and meanings with your child.
