

Police Report August/September 2022



Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to 44 calls for service between August 16th, 2022 to September 23rd, 2022. 31 written violations and warning tickets were issued to drivers between the above dates for various motor vehicle related offences. Highway and road safety continues to be a focus for the Hudson's Hope RCMP.

Please make note of the numerous construction sites along Hwy 29, between Hudson's Hope and Fort St. John. Due to the increase of work sites along the highway, there is a large fluctuation between the speed zones for each site. Police will be monitoring these areas as they are a posted construction zone and fines will range from \$196.00 to \$253.00 for speeding violations within a marked construction zone.

Additionally, the Hudson's Hope RCMP would like to remind motorists that the marked 30km/hr school zone along Beattie Dr. is active again between the hours of 8am to 5pm, Monday to Friday. RCMP members have been active over the past week in reminding motorist of this and have issued several speeding related violation tickets over the past 3 days.

On August 18th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a theft at the Hudson's Hope Public Works Yard. It was found that several litres of fuel and jerry cans had been stolen from the site. File remains open for further investigation.

On August 19th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to a single motor vehicle accident along the Kobes Creek FSR. Upon investigation, police found that the driver incurred non-life threatening injuries and was believed to be under the influence of alcohol. Charges are pending and the file remains open for further investigation.

On August 21st, the Hudson's Hope RCMP conducted boat patrols on Dinosaur Lake to check vessels for proof of competency and compliance with the Canada Shipping Act and Small Vessel Regulations. From the patrol, several vessels were checked and violation tickets were issued to operators for various offences.

On August 23rd, the Hudson's Hope RCMP were called to a possible theft in progress at the Hudson's Hope Senior Secondary School, after several individuals were observed taking items from a large bin outside the school. Upon investigations, it was found that the "insulation thieves" actually had permission to take these items and no offence was committed. Police have also identified the "pint sized" getaway driver from this incident!

On August 29th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a break and enter / mischief at the BC Hydro microwave site atop Bullhead Mountain. It was found that unknown persons had gained access to within the site via climbing under the barbed wire. Minor damages were incurred to the site but no access was gained to the main buildings. File remains open for further investigation.

On September 10th, after receiving confirmation that due to the local Battleship Mountain Wildfire, the current Evacuation Alert for the area had been stepped up to a full

Evacuation Order for the entirety of the Hudson's Hope Township. With the assistance of SAR's, HHFD, and the EOC, the RCMP was able to conduct a full evacuation of the town with minor issues and minimal resistance. The Order was rescinded later in the week, and the RCMP assisted the BCWF and EOC in making the town safe for all residents to return home. It was found that no major issues in regards to the safety and security of personal residences had occurred while residents were away from their homes. This is due to the amazing joint efforts from all the involved agencies and local persons who assisted during this incident. From all of us here at the Hudson's Hope RCMP, we would like to say a big thank you to all involved in keeping our community safe.

On September 20th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of shots being fired at the Hudson's Hope Airstrip/aerodrome. Upon investigation, police located and arrested an individual for careless use of a Firearm after it was determined that a firearm had been discharged several times in an unsafe manner, which endangered local residents. This file remains open for investigation and court processes.

Last of all, here are some words from newly promoted, Sgt. Rob Gardner, who recently left the Hudson's Hope RCMP after taking a new posting elsewhere in the Province:

Well Hudson's Hope, as many of you know, I have been promoted and recently transferred from your amazing community. When I arrived in May 2020, we were all learning to navigate with the global pandemic and I left right after the evacuation order lifted from the wildfire 2022.

Small communities like yours is bittersweet for police officers. You take us into your community and make us one of your own. We have the chance to learn so much, that sometimes it allows us to advance our careers which makes us leave your community quickly.

I'd like to thank you all for the experiences and chance to live, play and work in your community. I will be back to visit and say Hi!

Continue to look after each other and enjoy everything the area has to offer. I have so many memories and stories to share.

On this note, I would like to inform the residents that I, Cst. Erich Schmidt, have been put in place as the detachment's Acting Commander for the foreseeable future. I will continue to provide the same professional and often amusing police services for this great community that my family and myself call home.

Our September title, "This Time Tomorrow" by Emma Straub, is about Alice, who wakes to find "herself back in 1996, reliving her 16th birthday. But it isn't just her adolescent body that shocks her, or seeing her high school crush, it's her dad: the vital, charming, 40-something version of her father with whom she is reunited. Now armed with a new perspective on her own life and his, some past events take on new meaning. Is there anything that she would change if she could?"

Library Layout Project: During the last two weeks of August, we started updating our library layout! There are a few outstanding portions of the project yet to complete. I am writing this before we even start the project! So if all goes to plan, by the time this Bulletin is in print, we should be done all of the layout shifts! All sections and office areas have been relocated. In the end, that even included a section shuffle within the children's library, so the little ones do not feel left out of the layout changes.

We are so excited to share our new space with you all! We already know that we need to extend the work in to the first and possibly second week of September, as our office partition vendor order is due to arrive by September 8th. This portion of the work should not impact availability of our collections.

As this is being written, we are still making plans for further spending in accordance with our annual capital budget, which may include a new printer, programming tables and an additional amount of funds set aside specifically for this layout project.

Provincial Grant: As mentioned in last month's Bulletin, we were awarded a provincial grant for \$26797.75 from the Ministry of Municipal Affairs. This grant is for COVID-19 relief and recovery as well as emergency preparedness. We allocated approximately \$18,500 for the layout project, including the partitions, extra staff hours to carry-out the project, as well as additional furniture and shelving upgrades. A further \$4400 has been used for updating two of our staff computers to laptops with docking stations, and the final \$3900 will supplement our staff wages through 2023 to support emergency planning and preparedness policy updates.

Library Programs: We require that all children and youth attending our programs be preregistered, with the exception of teens who may self-register. Please pay attention to PSAs and our Facebook page for program updates, if any changes or cancellations need to be made, we will announce them on those platforms.



Homeowner Information to Building Permits

The District of Hudson's Hope wants to assist homeowners and contractors to avoid unnecessary delays and expense in planning and construction of residential projects. Below explains when permits are required, requirements for the permit, possible other documents that may be required and other information to assist you in obtaining your building permit. Additional information is available at the District Office or online at www.hudsonshope.ca

A BUILDING PERMIT IS REQUIRED TO:

- construct a new home;
- → locate mobile / modular home;
- construct a commercial, industrial or public use building;
- construct a new accessory building e.g., carport, farm building, garage or storage shed;
- renovate existing buildings;
- undertake any structural work such as interior partitions;
- enclose a porch or roof over a sundeck;
- move or demolish a building;
- → re-roof a building;
- reconstruct after damage;
- plumbing system changes;

INFORMATION TO BE SUBMITTED WITH A BUILDING PERMIT APPLICATION

The following items must be supplied along with a completed Building Permit Application before a Building Permit can be issued. A Building Permit fee is based on the value of the building or structure and will be calculated by the Building Official.


1. BUILDING PLANS


Two sets of detailed building plans. If you cannot draw the necessary building or site plans, then you should obtain the services of a qualified person.

Example Floor Plans

- scale not less than 1:50 metric (1/4 inch to 1 foot);
- size and location of windows and doors;
- location of all plumbing fixtures;
- location of all mechanical equipment.

- all rooms, size and use of each;
- all dimensions;
- finished and unfinished areas; —





2. SITE PLAN

- full legal description of lot: lot number, plan number; district lot number (from your tax notice or Title);
- lot dimensions;
- adjoining street names;
- locations and uses of existing and proposed buildings or additions;
- distances from all property lines for existing and proposed buildings or additions;
- location of legal road access to the property;
- size, location and number of parking spaces;
- existing and proposed wells or other water sources;
- location of existing or proposed sewage disposal fields on property;
- location of any watercourses on property showing distances from existing or proposed buildings or additions;

This information is intended to assist the general public in applying for a Building Permit within the District of Hudson's Hope.

BUILDING INSPECTIONS (Typical)

The Building Bylaw requires inspections at the following stages of construction;

- Footings prior to pouring concrete.
- Backfilling after completion of damp-proofing, drain tile, and drain rock (if required), but prior to backfilling.
- Plumbing before any part of the plumbing system is covered.
- Framing after the entire rough-in plumbing, electrical and mechanical equipment is installed and the framing is completed to lockup stage, but prior to insulating.
- Insulation and Vapour Barrier after all insulation and vapour barriers are installed, but prior to covering.
- Final when the building or portion thereof is completed and ready for occupancy, but prior to occupancy thereof.

An Occupancy Certificate is required prior to occupancy of a building. In order for an Occupancy Certificate to be issued, all inspections above must be approved.






