# PROTECTIVE SERVICES

#### What is a Winter Tire?

British Columbia accepts "mountain snowflake" or "mud and snow" tires with at least 3.5 mm tread as winter tires.

Check your tires for these signs: The mountain/snowflake symbol on the side of the tire These winter tires offer the best traction on snow and ice, and in cold weather.

The mud and snow symbol on the side of the tire These winter tires offer better traction than summer tires, however, they are less effective than mountain/snowflake tires on snow and ice, and in cold weather.

**3.5 mm tread** Tires must have 3.5 mm of tread remaining to be considered winter tires.

Matching Winter Tires You must have at least 2 matching winter tires on the same axle, but it is recommended to use 4 matching tires.

#### Studded Tires

May be used on BC highways from October 1 to April 30, but **must** have



mountain/snowflake or M+S symbols to be considered winter tires.

## When are Winter Tires or Chains Right for Me?

Winter tires and chains can make your vehicle safer.

You **MUST** use winter tires (passenger vehicles) or carry chains (commercial trucks) between October 1 and March 31 on **most BC Highways**.

British Columbia's climates range from freezing cold to pleasantly mild in the winter; equipping your vehicle appropriately depends on what you are driving and where you are driving. Drivers in some parts of the southern coast, where regulations are more relaxed due to warmer weather, should use discretion when equipping their vehicles.

## BC Conservation Officer Service RAPP and Wildlife Safety Links



There have been numerous sightings of a bear in the downtown core. We recommend you report these sightings to the BC Conservation Officer.

If you observe dangerous wildlife in an urban area involved in any of the following, please report the incident:

- Accessing garbage or other human supplied food sources.
- Instances where wildlife cannot be easily scared off.
- Dangerous wildlife is in a public location like a city park or school during daylight hours.
- When a cougar or wolf is seen in a urban area.

Observing dangerous wildlife in the woods, back country, forested areas or a wildlife interface is normal. We recommend that anyone spending time in these areas should ensure that they are familiar with how to react should they encounter dangerous wildlife.

The Report All Poachers and Polluters (RAPP) hotline should be used to report wildlife-human interactions where public safety may be at risk.



# Wood debris burning to begin near Hudson's Hope

Burning of wood debris will begin as early as November 2022, if conditions allow, on Peace River islands near Hudson's Hope.

Site C includes an 83-kilometre reservoir that will extend west from the dam site to Hudson's Hope and the reservoir area needs to be clear of trees and vegetation to prepare for filling.

Burning takes place during weather periods known as venting windows. These are periods established by the Ministry of Environment when appropriate weather and wind conditions are favorable to carry smoke away from the community of Hudson's Hope.

#### What to expect:

- Wood debris burning will begin as early as November 2022 and extend as late as March 2023.
- Wood debris burning will only begin when sufficient and sustained snow cover is observed.
- Visible smoke and flames from controlled burning of wood debris piles on the islands in the Peace River (approximately 500 metres from Hudson's Hope) and along the North Bank (in and around Highway 29 from Gates Island to Lynx Creek).
- O Increased smoke and lower visibility while wood debris burning takes place.
- The burning of wood debris in this area is anticipated to take three to twelve days intermittently over the burning season, depending on the weather conditions.
- Some noise from aerial helicopter ignition of wood debris piles may be present for short periods.

Burning activities follow the Site C Smoke Management Plan for monitoring all burning, including the timing, the size and location of the wood piles, and the smoke being emitted.

# Homeowner Information to Building Permits

The District of Hudson's Hope wants to assist homeowners and contractors to avoid unnecessary delays and expense in planning and construction of residential projects. Below explains when permits are required, requirements for the permit, possible other documents that may be required and other information to assist you in obtaining your building permit. Additional information is available at the District Office or online at www.hudsonshope.ca

#### A BUILDING PERMIT IS REQUIRED TO:

- → construct a new home;
- → locate mobile / modular home;
- construct a commercial, industrial or public use building;
- construct a new accessory building e.g., carport, farm building, garage or storage shed;
- → renovate existing buildings;
- undertake any structural work such as interior partitions;
- enclose a porch or roof over a sundeck;
- move or demolish a building;
- → re-roof a building;
- → reconstruct after damage;
- plumbing system changes;

#### INFORMATION TO BE SUBMITTED WITH A BUILDING PERMIT APPLICATION

The following items must be supplied along with a completed Building Permit Application before a Building Permit can be issued. A Building Permit fee is based on the value of the building or structure and will be calculated by the Building Official.


#### 1. BUILDING PLANS


Two sets of detailed building plans. If you cannot draw the necessary building or site plans, then you should obtain the services of a qualified person.

#### Example Floor Plans

- scale not less than 1:50 metric (1/4 inch to 1 foot);
- size and location of windows and doors;
- location of all plumbing fixtures;
- location of all mechanical equipment.

- all rooms, size and use of each;
- all dimensions:
- finished and unfinished areas; -





#### 2. SITE PLAN

- full legal description of lot: lot number, plan number; district lot number (from your tax notice or Title);
- lot dimensions;
- adjoining street names;
- locations and uses of existing and proposed buildings or additions;
- distances from all property lines for existing and proposed buildings or additions;
- location of legal road access to the property;
- size, location and number of parking spaces;
- existing and proposed wells or other water sources;
- location of existing or proposed sewage disposal fields on property;
- location of any watercourses on property showing distances from existing or proposed buildings or additions;

# This information is intended to assist the general public in applying for a Building Permit within the District of Hudson's Hope.

#### **BUILDING INSPECTIONS (Typical)**

The Building Bylaw requires inspections at the following stages of construction;

- Footings prior to pouring concrete.
- Backfilling after completion of damp-proofing, drain tile, and drain rock (if required), but prior to backfilling.
- Plumbing before any part of the plumbing system is covered.
- Framing after the entire rough-in plumbing, electrical and mechanical equipment is installed and the framing is completed to lockup stage, but prior to insulating.
- Insulation and Vapour Barrier after all insulation and vapour barriers are installed, but prior to covering.
- Final when the building or portion thereof is completed and ready for occupancy, but prior to occupancy thereof.

An Occupancy Certificate is required prior to occupancy of a building. In order for an Occupancy Certificate to be issued, all inspections above must be approved.



#### Police Report September / October 2022



The Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to 27 calls for service between September 24<sup>th</sup>, 2022 and October 20<sup>th</sup>, 2022. Approximately 15 written violations and warning tickets were issued to drivers between the above dates for various motor vehicle related offences. BC Highway Patrol is a dedicated RCMP traffic unit which has also been active in the area, assisting with traffic safety enforcement.

On October 2, 2022 Police stopped a vehicle in town for driving without due care and stunting. Stunting occurs when a driver deliberately loses traction, spins their tires, drives into on-coming traffic, prevents other vehicles from passing, or drives too close to other vehicles. The driver was charged, and his vehicle was impounded for seven days.

Most of us can't remember a highway without flaggers and construction sites... well take heart, we are nearing the end... kind of... actually never mind, I don't think we are nearing the end at all, maybe one day our grandchildren will enjoy smooth travelling along brand new bridges and dark-black asphalt. With that being said, it is important for drivers to be vigilant and aware of construction speed zones which do vary from week to week. Speeding fines are increased when violations occur in construction zones.

We in the Hudson's Hope RCMP are well aware that all of you know our secret hiding spot for traffic enforcement in the school zone. But, beware! We have been known to tactically reposition and conceal our presence. On top of that, Cst. SCHMIDT still owns several Ghillies suits (including a white one for winter months). All joking aside, traffic enforcement in the school zone is one of our top priorities, and driver's are reminded to exercise caution and be aware of speed limit changes in the school zone.

The Hudson's Hope RCMP has recently investigated several reports of fraud. During the course of these investigations, police have been able to obtain judicial authorization for several production orders which have enabled police to identify suspects. Some of the more recent frauds were the result of Interac e-Transfers that were sent in response to advertisements on Facebook

buy-and-sell pages. Financial institutions cannot reverse e-Transfers, and there is no method of recovering funds lost through an e-Transfer. It is important to exercise diligence when making purchases online, and where possible, to view items in person before purchasing from a private seller. For more information on steps to avoid becoming a victim of fraud, contact the Hudson's Hope RCMP detachment.

Between September 24<sup>th</sup>, 2022 and October 20<sup>th</sup>, 2022 police responded to two separate reports of domestic violence. Both instances were resolved safely, and in one case, the suspect was arrested and charged with assault. Domestic violence encompasses more than just physical assault. On the Province of BC Criminal Justice System webpage, domestic violence is defined as "any form of violence within an [intimate partner] relationship (marriage, common-law, or dating) - sexual, emotional, financial and psychological, including threats." If you or someone you know is a victim of domestic violence, there is help available. For all emergencies, dial 9-1-1 for police assistance. There is also help available through VictimLinkBC 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, by calling or texting 1-800-563-0808 or by sending an email to VictimLinkBC@bc211.ca. This service provides information and referral services to all victims of crime and immediate crisis support to victims of family and sexual violence, including victims of human trafficking.

Lastly, change is still in the air. You may recall holding back tears of emotion from last month's bulletin in which Corporal GARDNER announced that he was promoted to Sergeant, and was transferring to another detachment elsewhere in the province. Well, as it turns out, you will need to get the Kleenex box out again because Hudson's Hope will soon bid a fond farewell to Cst. HART and his family who will be transferring to coastal detachment in BC. The RCMP staffing unit is actively involved in identifying interested candidates to continue to provide high quality police service to Hudson's Hope BC.

#### CHANGES TO PST PAID ON PRIVATE VEHICLE SALES

Earlier this year, the Ministry of Finance announced that effective October 1, 2022 changes will be made to how the Provincial Sales Tax (PST) will be calculated on vehicles purchased privately or imported into Canada.

- Any vehicles sold or purchased by a PST/GST registrant (such as a dealership) will not be impacted by this change.
- This change means that at the time of registration, brokers will compare
  the average wholesale value (Canadian Black Book) and the declared purchase price value, and select the greater value of the two to calculate the
  PST amount that is due.
- While there are some exceptions such as gifted, modified, and collector vehicles, generally the PST collected on motor vehicle purchase will be either the purchase price or the Canadian Black Book value, whichever is greater.

#### **Appraisals**

If you believe the actual value of your vehicle is less than the average wholesale value due to various factors such as excessive wear, vehicle damage or mechanical issues, you have two options on how to proceed:

- you can decide to not proceed with the transaction and have the vehicle appraised and then return to complete the transaction, or
- you can choose to proceed with the transaction and pay PST on the higher amount and then complete the appraisal and submit the required documents to Consumer Taxation Branch within 30 days.

## \*In order to be eligible to submit an appraisal, the purchase price must be lower than the wholesale value.\*

The Motor Vehicle Appraisal Form (FIN320) can be found on the Consumer Taxation Branch website.

The appraised retail value of a vehicle can be determined by:

- a motor dealer registered under the *Motor Dealer Act*,
- a person authorized under the law of another jurisdiction to carry on business in that jurisdiction in a manner similar to a motor dealer under the Motor Dealer Act, or
- a person whose business it is to appraise vehicles.

Questions about the completing the Motor Vehicle Appraisal Form (FIN320) should be directed to Consumer Taxation Branch.

If the appraised value of the purchase price are both less than the average wholesale price of the vehicle, the PST calculation will be based on the purchase price or the appraised value, whichever is greater.

If you want to get an appraisal before registering, the appraisal must be completed within 30 days before you register the vehicle.

#### Refunds

For a refund to be considered, the appraised value and the purchase price must both be less than the average wholesale value of the vehicle.

The Consumer Taxation Branch will calculate PST due on the purchase price or the appraised value of the vehicle, whichever is greater.

If you are eligible for a refund, you will need to submit the completed Motor Vehicle Appraisal Form (FIN 320) to the Consumer Taxation Branch, along with an Application for Refund of PST Paid on a Motor Vehicle (FIN 355/MV).

Consumer Taxation Branch must receive the documents from customers within 30 days from the date of registration to receive a refund, if eligible.

All refund applications must be mailed to the Consumer Taxation branch and will not be accepted by email or fax.

#### WWI Battlefield Artist "Mary Riter Hamilton".

Mary Riter Hamilton was born September 7, 1867, in Teeswater, Ontario and died in Coquitlam, British Columbia in April of 1954. She was a sister of the late **Frank Riter** of Hudson's Hope, BC.

After WWI ended in 1918 Mary Riter Hamilton traveled to Europe to paint the war. Her paintings are a document of the destruction and devastation of the war. Her paintings included the locations of Vimy Ridge, Somme and Ypres. She completed some 350 painting in a span of 3 years, before traveling back to Canada.
