

Heating Safety

There is something about the winter months and curling up with a good book by the fireplace. But did you know that heating equipment is one of the leading causes of home fire deaths? With a few simple safety tips and precautions you can prevent most heating fires from happening.

BE WARM AND SAFE THIS WINTER!

- Weep anything that can burn at least three-feet away from heating equipment, like the furnace, fireplace, wood stove, or portable space heater.
- Have a three-foot "kid-free zone" around open fires and space heaters.
- Never use your oven to heat your home.
- Have a qualified professional install stationary space heating equipment, water heaters or central heating equipment according to the local codes and manufacturer's instructions.
- Have heating equipment and chimneys cleaned and inspected every year by a qualified professional.
- Remember to turn portable heaters off when leaving the room or going to bed.
- Always use the right kind of fuel, specified by the manufacturer, for fuel burning space heaters.
- Make sure the fireplace has a sturdy screen to stop sparks from flying into the room. Ashes should be cool before putting them in a metal container. Keep the container a safe distance away from your home.

Heating Equipment Smarts

Install wood burning stoves following manufacturer's instructions or have a professional do the installation. All fuel-burning equipment should be vented to the outside to avoid carbon monoxide (CO) poisoning.

Install and maintain CO alarms to avoid the risk of CO poisoning. If you smell gas in your gas heater, do do not light the appliance. Leave the home immediately and call your local fire department or gas company.

Half of home heating fires are reported during the months of **December**, **January**, and **February**.

Homeowner Information to Building Permits

The District of Hudson's Hope wants to assist homeowners and contractors to avoid unnecessary delays and expense in planning and construction of residential projects. Below explains when permits are required, requirements for the permit, possible other documents that may be required and other information to assist you in obtaining your building permit. Additional information is available at the District Office or online at www.hudsonshope.ca

A BUILDING PERMIT IS REQUIRED TO:

- → construct a new home;
- → locate mobile / modular home;
- construct a commercial, industrial or public use building;
- construct a new accessory building e.g., carport, farm building, garage or storage shed;
- renovate existing buildings;
- undertake any structural work such as interior partitions;
- enclose a porch or roof over a sundeck;
- → move or demolish a building;
- → re-roof a building;
- → reconstruct after damage;
- plumbing system changes;

INFORMATION TO BE SUBMITTED WITH A BUILDING PERMIT APPLICATION

The following items must be supplied along with a completed Building Permit Application before a Building Permit can be issued. A Building Permit fee is based on the value of the building or structure and will be calculated by the Building Official.


1. BUILDING PLANS


Two sets of detailed building plans. If you cannot draw the necessary building or site plans, then you should obtain the services of a qualified person.

Example Floor Plans

- scale not less than 1:50 metric (1/4 inch to 1 foot);
- size and location of windows and doors;
- location of all plumbing fixtures;
- location of all mechanical equipment.

- all rooms, size and use of each;
- all dimensions:
- finished and unfinished areas; -





2. SITE PLAN

- full legal description of lot: lot number, plan number; district lot number (from your tax notice or Title);
- lot dimensions;
- adjoining street names;
- locations and uses of existing and proposed buildings or additions;
- distances from all property lines for existing and proposed buildings or additions;
- location of legal road access to the property;
- size, location and number of parking spaces;
- existing and proposed wells or other water sources;
- location of existing or proposed sewage disposal fields on property;
- location of any watercourses on property showing distances from existing or proposed buildings or additions;

This information is intended to assist the general public in applying for a Building Permit within the District of Hudson's Hope.

BUILDING INSPECTIONS (Typical)

The Building Bylaw requires inspections at the following stages of construction;

- Footings prior to pouring concrete.
- Backfilling after completion of damp-proofing, drain tile, and drain rock (if required), but prior to backfilling.
- Plumbing before any part of the plumbing system is covered.
- Framing after the entire rough-in plumbing, electrical and mechanical equipment is installed and the framing is completed to lockup stage, but prior to insulating.
- Insulation and Vapour Barrier after all insulation and vapour barriers are installed, but prior to covering.
- Final when the building or portion thereof is completed and ready for occupancy, but prior to occupancy thereof.

An Occupancy Certificate is required prior to occupancy of a building. In order for an Occupancy Certificate to be issued, all inspections above must be approved.



Police Report October / November 2022



Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to 16 calls for service between October 20th to November 21st, 2022. 28 written violations and warning tickets were issued to drivers between the above dates for various motor vehicle related offences. Highway and road safety continues to be a focus for the Hudson's Hope RCMP.

Please make note of the numerous construction sites along Hwy 29, between Hudson's Hope and Fort St. John. Due to the increase of work sites along the highway, there is a large fluctuation between the speed zones for each site. Police will be monitoring these areas as they are a posted construction zone and fines will range from \$196.00 to \$253.00 for speeding violations within a marked construction zone.

On October 24th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of property damage to an apartment complex along Paquette Ave. Upon investigations it was found that there were no criminal aspects to the incident and that the matter was to be taken up in Civil Courts.

On October 27th, Hudson's Hope RCMP stopped a motorist for speeding in the school zone along Beattie Dr. Upon identifying the occupants of the vehicle, it was found that one of the occupants had several outstanding warrants out for their arrest. Subsequently, the individual was arrested and brought before a judge.

On October 28th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received several complaints for motorists speeding through the new Farrell Creek bridge projects area. Upon police conducting patrols, several vehicles were stopped and multiple violations tickets were issued to drivers this day.

On November 2nd, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received several calls regarding a deer that had "stolen" some Halloween decorations from a local residence and was now wearing this item atop its antlers and was seen sporting it around town. Cst. SCHMIDT located the 4-legged thief, easily identifiable given the white webbing headdress that he was then wearing, and upon

trying to apprehend the suspect, he fled from police. Due to not being able to catch up to the suspect in a foot pursuit, local Conservation was notified and plans were made to try and apprehend this suspect in a different manner, so to retrieve the stolen item. Two days later, it was found that the 4-legged thief had discarded this item amongst a tree and was no longer trying to hide his antlers. It is belief that this buck was merely trying to disquise himself during hunting season so no charges were sought.

On November 5th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a single motor vehicle accident along Kobes Creek FSR. Upon investigations, it was found that the vehicle had slide off the road and flipped. No injuries to the occupants. Alcohol and speed were determined to be the main factors behind the incident and charges are currently pending.

Being that Christmas is just around the corner, Cst. SCHMIDT would like to announce that he and his family, along with the support from the Friends of Hudson's Hope, the District of Hudson's Hope, and local businesses, will be conducting the annual "12 Days of Christmas Giving" toy drive again this year. As per the flyer that will soon be published, between December 1st to the 12th, we are looking for a variety of new toys and gift cards for ages 0-18, winter clothing for boys and girls, ages 6-12, as well as nice items for our seniors. 
