
## **JANUARY 9, 2023**

#### would like to say THANK YOU Hudson's Hope, for another successful year!

This year 2022 has been an amazing year. Wildflowers ran a successful Enrichment program from January to June, said goodbye to children off to kindergarten, said goodbye to children who moved away, and welcomed new full-time families. Wildflowers watched as children learned to speak their first words, walk, be potty trained, read their first words, develop social skills, learn cooperative play, and explore all that the outdoors had to offer. We searched for tadpoles, frogs and toads, grew our own garden tower, explored the forest, hunted for dinosaurs and fed the chickens! Currently, we are full and are not able to offer part spaces or the enrichment program. It doesn't mean these will not be available in the future, just not right now, so stay tuned!

Wildflowers Child Care welcomed teacher Jesse aboard as a part time Early Childhood Educational Assistant after she completed and earned her certification. This month we both attended and recertified our First Aide certificates.

Wildflowers believe in going above and beyond, this includes supporting families seeking support from the Child Development Centre, a specialist, or a support system to benefit their current journey as a family. Wildflowers Child Care is a Benefit corporation and believes in supporting families and community.

Wildflowers Child Care always seeks to find ways to keep daycare fees low and this year was no different. This Fall **Wildflowers Child Care signed a new partnership agreement with the Province of BC** enabling Wildflowers Child Care to offer new lower rates.

Starting December 2022, Fulltime daycare fees were almost cut in half! That means for parents, their fee portion is now as follows: **children under 37 months is \$533 per month and for children 37 month & older it is \$490 per month!** This rate is based on the average 20 days per month.



#### Police Report November / December 2022



Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to 11 calls for service between November 21<sup>st</sup>, 2022 and December 12<sup>th</sup>, 2022. 20 written violations and warning tickets were issued to drivers between the above dates for various motor vehicle related offences. Highway and road safety continues to be a focus for the Hudson's Hope RCMP.

Please make note of the numerous construction sites along Hwy 29, between Hudson's Hope and Fort St. John. Due to the increase of work sites along the highway, there is a large fluctuation between the speed zones for each site. Police will be monitoring these areas as they are a posted construction zone and fines will range from \$196.00 to \$253.00 for speeding violations within a marked construction zone.

On November 29<sup>th</sup>, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a sighting to possible stolen property. Police received information that a snowmobile which had been stolen back in 2012, was possibly sighted at a local residence. Police attended the residence to conduct an investigation but were unable to gather further evidence at the time to support that this sled was stolen. File remains open for further investigations. The Hudson's Hope RCMP would like to remind buyers that when purchasing used ORV's through private sales, it is best practice to conduct checks on the units VIN prior to purchasing, so to confirm that this unit is not part of a stolen property investigation. This can be conducted through ICBC or your local RCMP detachment.

On December 5<sup>th</sup>, the Hudson's Hope RCMP were advised to loose bison along Canyon Dr. after several bison nearly caused a motor vehicle accident. Police attended the area in which the furry suspects were last observed, and though fresh tracks were found, police deemed it unsafe to conduct a track through the frozen forests, therefore no confirmation could be made as to whom the owner of these furry escapees was.

On December 9<sup>th</sup>, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a Facebook fraud attempt. It was reported that an individual received a Facebook message from an unknown person who provided a link to a 50k grant. Upon following the link and applying for the said grant, the individual was asked to provide their photo identification and bank card information. Upon forwarding some of this information, the individual then received further communications requesting \$900 to process the grant. Fortunately, the individual did not send the requested funds and the incident was reported to police. This incident has since been forwarded to the Canadian Anti-Fraud Centre for further investigations.

# Homeowner Information to Building Permits

The District of Hudson's Hope wants to assist homeowners and contractors to avoid unnecessary delays and expense in planning and construction of residential projects. Below explains when permits are required, requirements for the permit, possible other documents that may be required and other information to assist you in obtaining your building permit. Additional information is available at the District Office or online at www.hudsonshope.ca

#### A BUILDING PERMIT IS REQUIRED TO:

- construct a new home;
- → locate mobile / modular home;
- construct a commercial, industrial or public use building;
- construct a new accessory building e.g., carport, farm building, garage or storage shed;
- renovate existing buildings;
- undertake any structural work such as interior partitions;
- enclose a porch or roof over a sundeck;
- → move or demolish a building;
- re-roof a building;
- → reconstruct after damage;
- → plumbing system changes;

#### INFORMATION TO BE SUBMITTED WITH A BUILDING PERMIT APPLICATION

The following items must be supplied along with a completed Building Permit Application before a Building Permit can be issued. A Building Permit fee is based on the value of the building or structure and will be calculated by the Building Official.


#### 1. BUILDING PLANS

Two sets of detailed building plans. If you cannot draw the necessary building or site plans, then you should obtain the services of a qualified person.


#### Example Floor Plans

- scale not less than 1:50 metric (1/4 inch to 1 foot);
- size and location of windows and doors;
- location of all plumbing fixtures;
- location of all mechanical equipment.

- all rooms, size and use of each;
- all dimensions;
- finished and unfinished areas; —

#### 2. SITE PLAN

- full legal description of lot: lot number, plan number; district lot number (from your tax notice or Title);
- lot dimensions;
- adjoining street names;
- locations and uses of existing and proposed buildings or additions;
- distances from all property lines for existing and proposed buildings or additions;
- location of legal road access to the property;
- size, location and number of parking spaces;
- existing and proposed wells or other water sources;
- location of existing or proposed sewage disposal fields on property;
- location of any watercourses on property showing distances from existing or proposed buildings or additions;

# This information is intended to assist the general public in applying for a Building Permit within the District of Hudson's Hope.

# STREET DRIVEWAY CROSSING EXISTING BUILDING ADDITION SUNDECK SCALE: SCALE:

#### **BUILDING INSPECTIONS (Typical)**

The Building Bylaw requires inspections at the following stages of construction;

- Footings prior to pouring concrete.
- Backfilling after completion of damp-proofing, drain tile, and drain rock (if required), but prior to backfilling.
- Plumbing before any part of the plumbing system is covered.
- Framing after the entire rough-in plumbing, electrical and mechanical equipment is installed and the framing is completed to lockup stage, but prior to insulating.
- Insulation and Vapour Barrier after all insulation and vapour barriers are installed, but prior to covering.
- Final when the building or portion thereof is completed and ready for occupancy, but prior to occupancy thereof.

An Occupancy Certificate is required prior to occupancy of a building. In order for an Occupancy Certificate to be issued, all inspections above must be approved.

#### Nancy Smith, InterLibrary Loan (ILL) Librarian & Bookkeeper


InterLibrary Loan: When ordering ILLs, we need to adhere to the original library's lending policies. Please make sure that you are able to keep a book by checking in with any of the library staff. Often if a title may not be renewed, it is noted on the lending paperwork and we try to let our patrons know when an item is not available for renewal. Most items, ordered through Sitka Evergreen's InterLibrary Connect, can be renewed based on the policies already built in the integrated library system. We do try to renew and give you a verbal confirmation of your renewal, as at times a renewal cannot be processed due to the item being needed by another patron. Usually you are able to renew twice online but if an item is not letting you renew, it is likely due to a hold or the lending libraries internal policies.

Please contact our staff for a tutorial on how to use the My Account feature on our website, to sign up for your own library card, or to simply place a hold or ILL. If you would like to order in an item that we do not own in our library, please email Nancy at ill.hhpl@pris.ca or call (250)783-9414 to request your items. You can order books, audiobook CDs as well as DVDs from most libraries.

# Heating Safety

There is something about the winter months and curling up with a good book by the fireplace. But did you know that heating equipment is one of the leading causes of home fire deaths? With a few simple safety tips and precautions you can prevent most heating fires from happening.

#### **BE WARM AND SAFE THIS WINTER!**

- Weep anything that can burn at least three-feet away from heating equipment, like the furnace, fireplace, wood stove, or portable space heater.
- Have a three-foot "kid-free zone" around open fires and space heaters.
- Never use your oven to heat your home.
- Have a qualified professional install stationary space heating equipment, water heaters or central heating equipment according to the local codes and manufacturer's instructions.
- Have heating equipment and chimneys cleaned and inspected every year by a qualified professional.
- Remember to turn portable heaters off when leaving the room or going to bed.
- Always use the right kind of fuel, specified by the manufacturer, for fuel burning space heaters.
- Make sure the fireplace has a sturdy screen to stop sparks from flying into the room. Ashes should be cool before putting them in a metal container. Keep the container a safe distance away from your home.
- ))) Test smoke alarms monthly.

#### Heating Equipment Smarts

Install wood burning stoves following manufacturer's instructions or have a professional do the installation. All fuel-burning equipment should be vented to the outside to avoid carbon monoxide (CO) poisoning.

Install and maintain CO alarms to avoid the risk of CO poisoning. If you smell gas in your gas heater, do do not light the appliance. Leave the home immediately and call your local fire department or gas company.


