Police Report January/ February 2023



Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to 33 calls for service between January 19th, and February 19th. 57 written violations and warning tickets were issued to drivers between the above dates for various motor vehicle related offences. Highway and road safety continues to be a focus for the Hudson's Hope RCMP.

Please make note of the new **"NO LEFT TURN"** sign that has been erected at the intersection of Osbourne St. and Canyon Dr. This sign has been put in place for motorist and residential safety. An offence of "Improper Turn at Intersection" comes with a fine of \$109.00.

On January 20th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP stopped a vehicle along Hwy 29 for speeding and upon the investigation, it was found that the driver was prohibited from driving. The driver was subsequently charged and this matter is before the courts.

On February 2nd, the Hudson's Hope RCMP assisted BC Conservation after receiving a report of a possible poaching incident that occurred on the Twelve Mile Rd. Based on the investigation, a Burnaby, BC resident was charged with several Wildlife Act charges after officers found two illegally shot elk on private property. This matter is before the courts.

On February 4th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of an online fraud in which an individual made a private purchase via etransfer for an item that was listed for sale on the Marketplace. Upon the etransfer being sent, the seller then blocked all further communications and the item was never provided to the buyer. Police are advising to use caution when conducting purchases via social media buy & sell sites being that these have become a "hotspot" for fraudulent transactions. Whether you've been scammed or targeted by a fraudster, you should always report it to the Canadian Anti-Fraud Centre: www.antifraudcentre.ca or call: 1-888-495-8501.

On February 5th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP stopped a motorist along the Beryl Prairie Rd. for impaired driving. Upon the road-side sobriety test being administered, the driver blew a fail thus resulting in a 90-day driving prohibition and a 30-day vehicle impound.

On February 8th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received several reports of mischief after numerous vehicles in the area had been found to either have gas caps removed or items found that indicated that someone had tried to syphon gas out of the fuel tanks. No suspects were observed and as it appears, the unknown person was unsuccessful in obtaining any fuel.

Monteith Street



Fred Monteith

The year was 1911. **Frederick Fulton Monteith** and Bill Carter arrive at Cache Creek (Bear Flats). They built a house on the lower flat for Fred and trapped during the winter. Monteith and Carter were soon drawn to Hudson's Hope as the many travellers that passed by on their way to Hudson's Hope referred to it as "the land of opportunity". They joined Tom Jamieson's party headed to Hudson's Hope, arriving here at the end of March 1912.

Fred Monteith became the First Ferryman, appointed by the Government. His job was to ferry persons across the Peace River by rowboat at which is now known as the "Ferry Landing". As the war raged on in 1916, Fred, along with many other young men from Hudson's Hope, signed up and went to war.

Upon Fred's return to Hudson's Hope, he worked as a Mine recorder and Postmaster. Fred retired from the Post Office when it was moved into Henry Stege's new store in 1934. Fred passed away at the age of 74 years on June 20, 1949.

Homeowner Information to Building Permits

The District of Hudson's Hope wants to assist homeowners and contractors to avoid unnecessary delays and expense in planning and construction of residential projects. Below explains when permits are required, requirements for the permit, possible other documents that may be required and other information to assist you in obtaining your building permit. Additional information is available at the District Office or online at www.hudsonshope.ca

A BUILDING PERMIT IS REQUIRED TO:

- ↳ construct a new home;
- ↳ locate mobile / modular home;
- ↳ construct a commercial, industrial or public use building;
- ↳ construct a new accessory building e.g., carport, farm building, garage or storage shed;
- ↳ renovate existing buildings;
- ↳ undertake any structural work such as interior partitions;
- ↳ enclose a porch or roof over a sundeck;
- ↳ move or demolish a building;
- ↳ re-roof a building;
- ↳ reconstruct after damage;
- ↳ plumbing system changes;

INFORMATION TO BE SUBMITTED WITH A BUILDING PERMIT APPLICATION

The following items must be supplied along with a completed Building Permit Application before a Building Permit can be issued. A Building Permit fee is based on the value of the building or structure and will be calculated by the Building Official.

1. BUILDING PLANS

Two sets of detailed building plans. If you cannot draw the necessary building or site plans, then you should obtain the services of a qualified person.

Example Floor Plans

- scale not less than 1:50 metric (1/4 inch to 1 foot);
- size and location of windows and doors;
- location of all plumbing fixtures;
- location of all mechanical equipment.
- all rooms, size and use of each;
- all dimensions;
- finished and unfinished areas; —

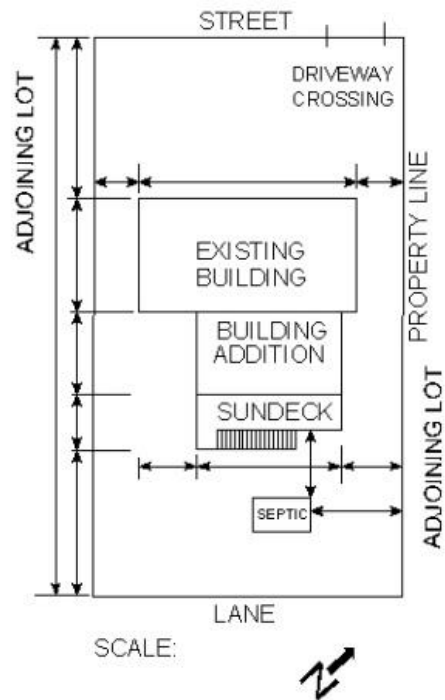




2. SITE PLAN

- full legal description of lot: lot number, plan number; district lot number (from your tax notice or Title);
- lot dimensions;
- adjoining street names;
- locations and uses of existing and proposed buildings or additions;
- distances from all property lines for existing and proposed buildings or additions;
- location of legal road access to the property;
- size, location and number of parking spaces;
- existing and proposed wells or other water sources;
- location of existing or proposed sewage disposal fields on property;
- location of any watercourses on property showing distances from existing or proposed buildings or additions;

This information is intended to assist the general public in applying for a Building Permit within the District of Hudson's Hope.



BUILDING INSPECTIONS (Typical)

The Building Bylaw requires inspections at the following stages of construction;

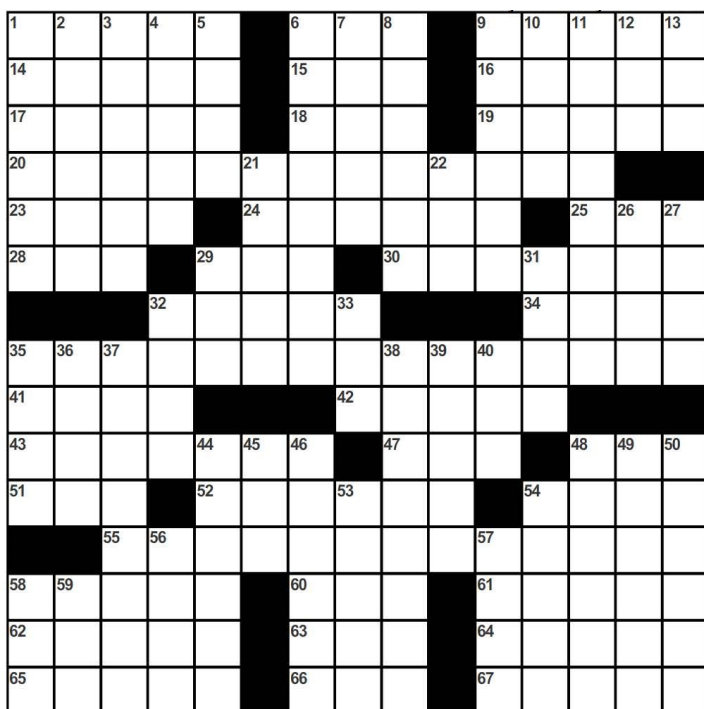
- Footings - prior to pouring concrete.
- Backfilling - after completion of damp-proofing, drain tile, and drain rock (if required), but prior to backfilling.
- Plumbing - before any part of the plumbing system is covered.
- Framing - after the entire rough-in plumbing, electrical and mechanical equipment is installed and the framing is completed to lockup stage, but prior to insulating.
- Insulation and Vapour Barrier - after all insulation and vapour barriers are installed, but prior to covering.
- Final - when the building or portion thereof is completed and ready for occupancy, but prior to occupancy thereof.

An Occupancy Certificate is required prior to occupancy of a building. In order for an Occupancy Certificate to be issued, all inspections above must be approved.
