SHOUT OUT TO HUDSON'S HOPE FIRE DEPARTMENT

On December 20th, 2022 I had the opportunity to work closely with you and the members of the Hudson's Hope Volunteer Fire Department at a house fire within the community. This is the second large fire I attended with you and your department, the first being the large Beryl Prairie fire last year. I want to pass along how impressed I was with your leadership as the Fire Chief and with the quality and abilities of your volunteer members in suppressing both of these fires. With the fire in December, the temperatures were hovering near -40 Celsius at the time which certainly was challenging for everyone involved. I observed you to provide clear direction to your members and to communicate professionally and effectively with BC Ambulance, BC Hydro and myself as partner agencies.

You also demonstrated the ability to think outside of the box by requesting a local business to keep everyone warm, to liaise with a nearby business to provide hot coffee and reaching out to other contacts in the community for tools and equipment in order to cut the floor to gain access to the fire. I have attended dozens of structure fires as a member of the Prince George and Kamloops RCMP Detachments over the course of my service with the RCMP. Although your team is comprised of volunteers working part time I did not notice any difference between your members and the full time City departments. Please share my comments with Mayor and Council.

PROTECTIVE SERVICES

SPRING BURNING

As the weather starts to warm up many folks are beginning to plan some spring-time cleanup activities including the removal of yard waste and debris. Please remember that under the Fire Protection & Life Safety Bylaw 775 which was adopted in 2010, no person shall light or start an open air fire within the District without first having obtained a Burning Permit from the Fire Chief or his designate. These permits are available at the District Office and can be issued for a onetime event or for an extended period of up to one year.

The only time a permit is not required is during the following situations:

- Burning refuse or garden waste only in an incinerator covered with a screen to prevent flying sparks and is approved by the Fire Chief
- The cooking of food using a portable barbeque apparatus
- Burning on privately owned lands or in developed campgrounds where fireplaces, stoves, and/or fire pits are provided and approved by the Fire Chief
- Burning by the Fire & Rescue Services for the purposes of training

If you are contemplating an open burn:

- Consider your options to compost, recycle, or haul the material to the Hudson's Hope Transfer Site.
- Be a good neighbour. Burn only when it will not affect the health and welfare of the community.
- Call the BC Ministry of Environment to check the ventilation index at 1-888-281-2992. The index must be "good" for the day of the burn and "fair" or "good" for the second day of the burn.
- Check the wind conditions. If the wind is strong enough to carry sparks and embers to other combustible materials postpone your burn.

Remember that your burn must comply with the Environmental Management Act and the Open Burning Smoke Control Regulation as well as the British Columbia Wildfire Act.

Please remember these measures are in place to protect the health and safety of you and your neighbours. If you have any further questions regarding your burning activities please stop by the District Office to speak to Brad Milton the Director of Protective Services, or call 783-9901.

Police Report February / March 2023



Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to 33 calls for service between February 19th to March 28th. 47 written violations and warning tickets were issued to drivers between the above dates for various motor vehicle related offences. Highway and road safety continues to be a focus for the Hudson's Hope RCMP.

Please make note of the new "NO LEFT TURN" sign that has been erected at the intersection of Osbourne St. and Canyon Dr. This sign has been put in place for motorist and residential safety. An offence of "Improper Turn at Intersection" comes with a fine of \$109.00.

On February 20th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a single motor vehicle accident along Farrell Creek Rd. The motorist lost control of the vehicle while attempting to slow down at a sharp corner, resulting in the vehicle sliding into the ditch and rolling several times. Due to the motorist utilizing their seatbelt, they incurred minor injuries. Weather was deemed a major factor in this incident.

On March 15th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report to a single motor vehicle accident along Kobes Rd. It was reported that the motorist was travelling Northbound along the road and for unknown reasons, the trailer jack-knifed, resulting in the trailer colliding with the truck. No injuries were incurred to the driver.

On March 17th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of an online fraud. It was reported that the complainant transferred a lump sum of money and personal information to an unknown individual after being convinced that the monies would assist them with their medical conditions. It was later found that this interaction was fraudulent in nature. File remains open for investigations. Whether you've been scammed or targeted by a fraudster, you should always report it to the Canadian Anti-Fraud Centre: www.antifraudcentre.ca or call: 1-888-495-8501.

On March 21st, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received several complaints to a large herd of bison that had escaped their paddock and were roaming along Beryl Prairie Rd. Police attended the area and confirmed that the escapee bison were eventually corralled and secured. File passed along to the Animal/Livestock Compliance Officer for the area.

On March 22nd, the Hudson's Hope RCMP stopped a motorist along Hwy 29 for excessive speed after the noted vehicle was confirmed travelling at a speed of 173km/hr in a marked 90km/hr zone. Police further confirmed that vehicle had invalid insurance. The driver received an excessive speed ticket along with other fines, and the vehicle was impounded for 7-days.

On March 27th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a boater who had ventured passed the "do not enter" area near the Peace Canyon Dam. Police attended the area and between police interactions and the blasting of the dam sirens, the boater eventually vacated the area. As of note, this area is marked as a "do not enter" for the safety of the public. Upon the dam releasing water from the spillways, the level of water in this area can rise within seconds and creates very unsafe circumstances for boaters and individuals in the immediate proximity.

Homeowner Information to Building Permits

The District of Hudson's Hope wants to assist homeowners and contractors to avoid unnecessary delays and expense in planning and construction of residential projects. Below explains when permits are required, requirements for the permit, possible other documents that may be required and other information to assist you in obtaining your building permit. Additional information is available at the District Office or online at www.hudsonshope.ca

A BUILDING PERMIT IS REQUIRED TO:

- construct a new home;
- locate mobile / modular home;
- construct a commercial, industrial or public use building;
- construct a new accessory building e.g., carport, farm building, garage or storage shed;
- renovate existing buildings;
- undertake any structural work such as interior partitions;
- enclose a porch or roof over a sundeck;
- → move or demolish a building;
- → re-roof a building;
- reconstruct after damage;
- plumbing system changes;

INFORMATION TO BE SUBMITTED WITH A BUILDING PERMIT APPLICATION

The following items must be supplied along with a completed Building Permit Application before a Building Permit can be issued. A Building Permit fee is based on the value of the building or structure and will be calculated by the Building Official.


1. BUILDING PLANS


Two sets of detailed building plans. If you cannot draw the necessary building or site plans, then you should obtain the services of a qualified person.

Example Floor Plans

- scale not less than 1:50 metric (1/4 inch to 1 foot);
- size and location of windows and doors;
- location of all plumbing fixtures;
- location of all mechanical equipment.

- all rooms, size and use of each;
- all dimensions;
- finished and unfinished areas; -





2. SITE PLAN

- full legal description of lot: lot number, plan number; district lot number (from your tax notice or Title);
- lot dimensions;
- adjoining street names;
- locations and uses of existing and proposed buildings or additions;
- distances from all property lines for existing and proposed buildings or additions;
- location of legal road access to the property;
- size, location and number of parking spaces;
- existing and proposed wells or other water sources;
- location of existing or proposed sewage disposal fields on property;
- location of any watercourses on property showing distances from existing or proposed buildings or additions;

This information is intended to assist the general public in applying for a Building Permit within the District of Hudson's Hope.

STREET DRIVEWAY CROSSING EXISTING BUILDING ADDITION SUNDECK LANE SCALE:

BUILDING INSPECTIONS (Typical)

The Building Bylaw requires inspections at the following stages of construction;

- Footings prior to pouring concrete.
- Backfilling after completion of damp-proofing, drain tile, and drain rock (if required), but prior to backfilling.
- Plumbing before any part of the plumbing system is covered.
- Framing after the entire rough-in plumbing, electrical and mechanical equipment is installed and the framing is completed to lockup stage, but prior to insulating.
- Insulation and Vapour Barrier after all insulation and vapour barriers are installed, but prior to covering.
- Final when the building or portion thereof is completed and ready for occupancy, but prior to occupancy thereof.

An Occupancy Certificate is required prior to occupancy of a building. In order for an Occupancy Certificate to be issued, all inspections above must be approved.







to be sponsored for immigration to Canada. In the early 1950's it was one long boat voyage and a train ride that brought him to Vancouver, B.C. where he married lise.


He worked at a steel factory in the Port of Vancouver for many years and then worked for 16 years at Grey Beverage Company delivering for 7-UP.
