# Tree Planting Rebate 2023

District of Hudson's Hope Tree
Planting Rebate Program

# NLY WHILE QUANTITIES LAST

All applicants are required to accept terms and conditions of the rebate program, which include:

- 1. Only trees purchased after January 1, 2023, and are identified as growing in Zone 1, 2 or 3 are eligible for rebate. Shrubs and flowers will not be eligible for this rebate. A limited number of rebates are available on a first-come, first-serve basis.
- 2. Each rebate is a maximum of \$50. If the price is below \$50, the rebated amount will be the actual purchase price. The subsidy will be issued in the form of a cheque payable to the purchaser.
- 3. Only one rebate per year per property will be issued.
- 4. To be eligible you must have a District of Hudson's Hope property tax account in your name, a completed rebate form, original purchase receipt (photocopies not accepted), and the tree tag indicating growing zone 1, 2 or 3.

- 5. Trees are to be planted at the address associated with the property tax account. Trees are not to be planted on public property, right of way or easement.
- 6. The District of Hudson's Hope accepts no responsibility for loss, damages or claims to property caused by or resulting from Community Tree Planting Rebate Policy.
- 7.The District of Hudson's Hope reserves the right to reverse the rebate if information provided on the application form is either incorrect or untrue, or if the terms and conditions have been breached.
- 8. The District of Hudson's Hope reserves the right to alter, cancel or discontinue the program at any time.

Applications must be delivered to the municipal office by **June 2nd, 2023** in a sealed envelope marked "**Scholarship Application**".



Alternately, you can report a wildfire to 9-1-1.



# What You'll Be Asked:

your phone number and the location of the fire
what the fire is burning (trees? What species?)
the size of the fire
how quickly the fire is spreading
the colour of the smoke
whether there are values or lives at risk

The details that you provide are critical in determining the type of response that the fire will receive from fire suppression authorities. Your help is greatly appreciated as it helps us to allocate our resources more efficiently and respond quickly to wildfire activity.

# Police Report March / April 2023



Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to 26 calls for service between March 28<sup>th</sup> to April 18<sup>th</sup>. 51 written violations and warning tickets were issued to drivers between the above dates for various motor vehicle related offences. Highway and road safety continues to be a focus for the Hudson's Hope RCMP.

On April 1<sup>st</sup>, Hudson's Hope RCMP stopped a motorist along Hwy 29 for excessive speed. The associated vehicle was confirmed to be travelling at rate of speed that was 69kms/hr over the posted speed limit within a construction zone. The driver of the vehicle was fined \$483.00 and received a 7-day impound of their vehicle.

On April 1<sup>st</sup>, the Hudson's Hope RCMP stopped another motorist for excessive speed after their vehicle was confirmed to be travelling at a rate of speed that was 59kms/hr over the posted speed limit. This driver received a \$368.00 fine and a 7-day impound of their vehicle.

As of note: The Motor Vehicle Act for the Province of British Columbia, defines Excessive Speeding as driving at a speed greater than 41kms/hr over the posted speed limit. The faster you drive, the higher the fine becomes! Exceeding the posted speed limit by 41-60km/hr comes with a \$368.00 fine and a 7-day impound of your vehicle, along with tow and impound fees. Exceeding the posted speed limit by 60kms/hr comes with a fine of \$483.00 and a 7-day impound of your vehicle, along with tow and impound fees. Police can impound your vehicle for excessive speed and is as follows:

- Seven days for first offence,
- Thirty days for second offence within two years,
- Sixty days for any later offence within two years.

On April 3<sup>rd</sup>, the Hudson's Hope received multiple reports of loose bison impeding traffic along Beryl Prairie Rd. Police attended scene and located several big furry suspects running loose along the municipal roadway and trespassing onto private property. These incidents are being monitored and investigated by police and other associated Provincial Enforcement Agencies. If one of these loose furry beasts is observed in your front yard or raiding your gardens, you can report the incident to the Hudson's Hope RCMP.

On April 5<sup>th</sup>, Hudson's Hope RCMP stopped a motorist for excessive speed along Beattie Drive after the associated vehicle was confirmed to be travelling at a rate of speed that was 47kms/hr over the posted speed limit within the school zone. The driver received a fine of \$368.00 and a 7-day impound of their vehicle.

As of note: Police Officers are granted an exemption under Section 122 of the Motor Vehicle Act that allows them exceed the posted speed limits when in the course of their duty, ie: to close the distance on a speeding motorist or when enroute to an emergency situation. Also, police may respond without The Bulletin 8 May 2023

using emergency lights and sirens, to an incident where the risk of harm to the public through using emergency equipment outweighs the risk of responding without it. (This exemption does not apply in school or playground zones).

On April 8<sup>th</sup>, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of an unidentified flying object with red and white lights, over the Peace River area. Upon investigation, it was found that the UFO was a drone that was being used by a company to locate hotspots amongst the slash piles that were being burnt off in the river valley.

Being that Spring is technically upon us again (finally), the Hudson's Hope RCMP would like to remind residents to be aware of the emerging bears from their long hibernations. Upon emerging from their long cozy earth dens, bears will be quite slow and groggy for several days, however, during this time, bears will be quite hungry and will be looking for easy meals, ie: left out garbage, compost piles, gardens, small pets, etc.

That said, if one is to become face to face with one of these furry creatures, please remember the following tips:

- Do not yell "awwwww" and try to get a selfie with said bear! They are not friendly and will taste test you!
- Stay calm, your calm behaviour can reassure the bear,
- Speak to the bear, talk calmly and firmly (and in English...Spanish seems to rile them up!),
- Do not turn and run but rather back away slowly while facing the bear,
- Make yourself appear BIG, pick up small children and stay within a group (if with others),
- If have a backpack on, do not remove being that it can provide protection should the bear attack,
- If planning an outdoor excursion in bear country, make lots of noise, travel in groups if able to, and carry bear spray (always examine the expire date on the spray...could be a bad time to discover that your bear spray has expired and is no longer potent!), and lastly, if you have to use the bear spray, pay attention to the wind direction. Spraying yourself only makes it easier for the bear and now you have also seasoned yourself!



# Homeowner Information to Building Permits

The District of Hudson's Hope wants to assist homeowners and contractors to avoid unnecessary delays and expense in planning and construction of residential projects. Below explains when permits are required, requirements for the permit, possible other documents that may be required and other information to assist you in obtaining your building permit. Additional information is available at the District Office or online at www.hudsonshope.ca

#### A BUILDING PERMIT IS REQUIRED TO:

- construct a new home;
- locate mobile / modular home;
- construct a commercial, industrial or public use building;
- construct a new accessory building e.g., carport, farm building, garage or storage shed;
- renovate existing buildings;
- undertake any structural work such as interior partitions;
- enclose a porch or roof over a sundeck;
- → move or demolish a building;
- → re-roof a building;
- → reconstruct after damage;
- plumbing system changes;

#### INFORMATION TO BE SUBMITTED WITH A BUILDING PERMIT APPLICATION

The following items must be supplied along with a completed Building Permit Application before a Building Permit can be issued. A Building Permit fee is based on the value of the building or structure and will be calculated by the Building Official.


#### 1. BUILDING PLANS


Two sets of detailed building plans. If you cannot draw the necessary building or site plans, then you should obtain the services of a qualified person.

#### **Example Floor Plans**

- scale not less than 1:50 metric (1/4 inch to 1 foot);
- size and location of windows and doors;
- location of all plumbing fixtures;
- location of all mechanical equipment.

- all rooms, size and use of each;
- all dimensions;
- finished and unfinished areas; -





#### 2. SITE PLAN

- full legal description of lot: lot number, plan number; district lot number (from your tax notice or Title);
- lot dimensions;
- adjoining street names;
- locations and uses of existing and proposed buildings or additions;
- distances from all property lines for existing and proposed buildings or additions;
- location of legal road access to the property;
- size, location and number of parking spaces;
- existing and proposed wells or other water sources;
- location of existing or proposed sewage disposal fields on property;
- location of any watercourses on property showing distances from existing or proposed buildings or additions;

# This information is intended to assist the general public in applying for a Building Permit within the District of Hudson's Hope.

# STREET PRIVEWAY CROSSING EXISTING BUILDING ADDITION SUNDECK LANE SCALE:

#### **BUILDING INSPECTIONS (Typical)**

The Building Bylaw requires inspections at the following stages of construction;

- Footings prior to pouring concrete.
- Backfilling after completion of damp-proofing, drain tile, and drain rock (if required), but prior to backfilling.
- Plumbing before any part of the plumbing system is covered.
- Framing after the entire rough-in plumbing, electrical and mechanical equipment is installed and the framing is completed to lockup stage, but prior to insulating.
- Insulation and Vapour Barrier after all insulation and vapour barriers are installed, but prior to covering.
- Final when the building or portion thereof is completed and ready for occupancy, but prior to occupancy thereof.

An Occupancy Certificate is required prior to occupancy of a building. In order for an Occupancy Certificate to be issued, all inspections above must be approved.



# **OPEN FIRE REGULATIONS**

# CAMPFIRES, CATEGORY 2 FIRES AND CATEGORY 3 FIRES: WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE?



# **CAMPFIRE:**

Any fire smaller than 0.5 metres high by 0.5 metres wide

#### **REGULATIONS:**



You must have ready access to 8 litres of water or a shovel for the entire time your campfire is lit.



Your campfire must be completely extinguished and the ashes must be cool to the touch before leaving the area for any length of time. (Hot coals can reignite the fire.)



During campfire prohibitions, only a CSA- or ULC-approved portable campfire apparatus may be used, and the flame height must not exceed 15 centimetres.



You must build a fire guard around your campfire.

# **CATEGORY 2 FIRE:**

- 1 to 2 concurrently burning piles no larger than 2 metres high by 3 metres
- Stubble or grass burning over an area less than 0.2 hectares

#### **REGULATIONS:**



A fuel break must be established around any Category 2 burn

At least one person equipped with a fire-fighting hand tool must monitor the fire at all times.

# CATEGORY 3 FIRE:

- Any fire larger than 2 metres high by 3 metres wide
  - 3 or more concurrently burning piles no larger than 2 metres high by 3
- 1 or more burning windrows Stubble or grass burning over an area greater than 0.2 hectares

#### **REGULATIONS:**



A fuel break must be established around any Category 3 burn



Monitor your open burn to spread beyond its intended size.



You must have a burn registration number to light a Category 3 open fire. Call the burn registration line 1 888 797-1717 to obtain one.

# GENERAL REGULATIONS:

**Thank You:** J. K. Rose, also known as Hudson's Hopes own Jessica Kempster, released her first self-published book in November of last year. Thank you Jessica for joining us for an intimate conversation about your new book! It was so interesting to get the insider details on your writing and publishing process. We look forward to reading the full trilogy when they are published!

**DIY Hydroponic Vegetable Gardening Presentation:** Have you ever wondered about hydroponic vegetable gardening? Bob Norton has been testing various methods of DIY hydroponic gardening over the past few years and will be sharing his method for growing greens all year round! Bob's hydroponic trialling has included growing different varieties of lettuce and bok choy through the winter, as well as using his system for tomatoes, tomatillos, cucumbers and peppers in a greenhouse. He grew tomatoes last year on his deck through the summer. PLUS! Those who RSVPd last month are able to start their own hydroponic seedling to take home using the Kratky method for free! This method can be kept all summer as is, or you can keep it growing until you have your own hydroponic pump system set up to transfer before the root ball gets too big to transfer. The hands on portion of this presentation is full, but if you are interested in attending the presentation and observing the Kratky method, please RSVP. We may need to change venues or move outside to accommodate more people to the presentation (not the actual planting portion, we are at capacity) The presentation will be on Tuesday in May 2<sup>nd</sup> at 6:00 pm. Kratky Method workshop immediately following, only registered attendees get a seedling although others are welcome to observe.

Walk-In Book Club: We loved Kate Quinn's *The Diamond Eye* so much that we brought it back with another title by the same author, *The Rose Code!* The first time we borrowed *Diamond Eye*, it was a shorter loan period, so we reserved 5 copies to allow our readers to finish reading the book, May 9th and June 23rd. *The Rose Code* has all 10 copies available until June 9th! # Nancy Smith, InterLibrary Loan (ILL) Librarian & Bookkeeper


InterLibrary Loans: Did you know that we have two separate systems to order ILLs? Through these systems you have access to other library collections throughout BC. Books and DVDs can be ordered from just about any public, municipal or regional library in BC. You are able to place a hold on your "my account" access through our website and catalogue. We also use this system as our go to source to check first for your loan. This is the Sitka Evergreen system and has access to many of the library collections in the province. We also have another system that we use as a backup that you can submit your requests to staff and we will order your loan for you, this allows the opportunity to select titles from other libraries that are not on the same library computer system as we are as well as BC universities and colleges. 


