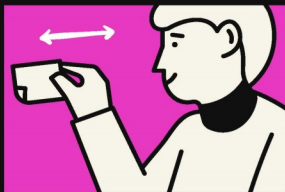

Hudson's Hope Community Hall
Celebrating 55 years
August 18, 19, 20, 2023

Over 60 years ago on the banks of the Peace River, was a small village called Hudson Hope. Then geologists came along and decided it was a "Mighty River, that Peace." Let's Dam it up and provide power for our growing province and cities.

So now; 1, 2, 3 Dams have been built. Many 10's of thousands of people have passed thru. So many that in 1968 the General George Pearkes School was built and opened. At that time you could have called us a "Trailer Court Town," with over 15 of them set up, from 10-40 in each. There is something about Hudson's Hope and the Peace River. You either love it and embrace it, or you don't.

Did you know that our Community Hall started as a hope to provide the teenagers in town with a place to get together? With the actions of Corporal Perry and JoAnn Chatten (Kelly), the building, a Recreation Centre for a contractor that was working for the W.A.C. Bennet Dam, (which was now filling with water to become a reservoir) was purchased for \$1.00.

By coming together in unity by volunteers, a basement was put in. My brother Roy Kelly was instrumental in that process and was the 1st band to play for these early "Teen Dances." Niles Clark provided the cement for the basement. It was called the "Teen Village Club." But, as you know, teenagers grow up and move on.

The "Community Hall Society" was formed in the 70's, represented by volunteer clubs and organizations. The Women's Club had a kitchen in the basement. The Lions Club would run the bar. A meeting place for all. When Ron Lapointe was president, the wings (sides) were added. The kitchen and washrooms were moved upstairs. Terry and Dorothy Peressini were the keepers of the Hall for many years. Then the Municipality took over the bookings and up keep.

It has been used for so many different dinners, meetings, events, weddings, funerals, dances, Reno Nights, Bingo, Grads, and even the school gym. Almost always by volunteers. So, I am reaching out to all these generations. To those who would like to help this Celebration happen, for all of us to remember, enjoy, share, and pass on.

Police Report



Hudson's Hope RCMP Monthly Police Report

The Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to 46 calls for service between June 21st and July 21st. 42 written violations and warning tickets were issued to drivers between the above dates for various motor vehicle related offences. Highway and road safety continues to be a focus for the Hudson's Hope RCMP.

On June 29th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP stopped a motorist along Hwy 29 for driving a wee bit too fast as the driver was stopped for traveling at a rate of speed of 47kms/hr over the posted speed limit. Subsequently, the driver received the non-inclusive Excessive Speed package which included a \$368.00 fine and a nice 7-day stay of their vehicle at the FSJ impound lot.

On June 30th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP attended a single motor vehicle accident along Canyon Drive. Upon investigation, it was found that a pick-up truck, containing four occupants, had veered off the road and rolled several times as the driver failed to navigate a sharp corner. As a result, one passenger was pronounced dead on-scene and the three other occupants were transported to hospital, all of whom incurred minor to severe injuries. Speed, alcohol, and the lack of seatbelts are all deemed factors in this accident. This incident remains under investigation and charges are pending.

On July 3rd, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of 5x missing persons that had ventured out onto Williston Lake but had not checked-in. Upon a full-scale search with helicopter, the missing persons were later located on a vessel and were confirmed to be in good health with no issues found. It was found that there was a lack of communication between the involved parties, resulting in a call for emergency services.

On July 7th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP stopped a motorist along Hwy 29 after it was confirmed they were travelling at a rate of speed in excess of 62km/hr over the speed limit. Subsequently, this driver received the Excessive Speed package which included a fine of \$483.00 and a 7-day impound of their vehicle.

On July 8th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to a report of a side x side that had rolled over with one person being ejected and injured. The driver was transported to hospital with non-life-threatening injuries and alcohol was deemed to be a factor in this accident. Charges are currently pending.

On July 8th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of 2x missing persons. It was reported that a mother and son were believed to be camping in the Hudson's Hope area and had plans to hike the Battleship Mountain trail, but had not checked in for a couple of days. Upon investigation, police were unable to locate the pair the first day but upon further patrols along the Johnson Creek FSR, the pair was located safe and sound the following day. Again, this was a scenario of miscommunications and individuals not checking in.

On July 15th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to a report of approximately 30-40 loose bison roaming along Farrell Creek Rd. It was found that these bison had escaped their enclosure and were causing havoc throughout residential properties and farmlands. Upon investigation, the well-known owner was confirmed and the bison were herded up and eventually returned to their enclosure.

On July 16th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP attended a residential property along Beryl Prairie Rd. for a report of a vehicle fire. Upon attending scene, a single, unoccupied commercial semi-truck was found to be engulfed in flames. The cause of the fire is currently unknown, but due to the swift response of the Beryl Prairie Fire crews, no other damages were incurred to outer-lying structures or agricultural lands.

The Hudson's Hope RCMP would like to remind residents to the topic of having visible address signs erected out front of their residences. This is a vital importance for when emergency responders need to locate and respond to a residence for an emergency situation. The seconds that can sometimes be lost while in search for a residence can mean the difference between life and death in some emergency situations! Homeowner Information to Building Permits

The District of Hudson's Hope wants to assist homeowners and contractors to avoid unnecessary delays and expense in planning and construction of residential projects. Below explains when permits are required, requirements for the permit, possible other documents that may be required and other information to assist you in obtaining your building permit. Additional information is available at the District Office or online at www.hudsonshope.ca

A BUILDING PERMIT IS REQUIRED TO:

- construct a new home;
- locate mobile / modular home;
- construct a commercial, industrial or public use building;
- construct a new accessory building e.g., carport, farm building, garage or storage shed;
- renovate existing buildings;
- undertake any structural work such as interior partitions;
- enclose a porch or roof over a sundeck;
- move or demolish a building;
- re-roof a building;
- reconstruct after damage;
- plumbing system changes;

INFORMATION TO BE SUBMITTED WITH A BUILDING PERMIT APPLICATION

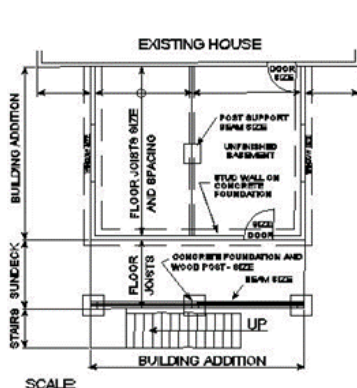
The following items must be supplied along with a completed Building Permit Application before a Building Permit can be issued. A Building Permit fee is based on the value of the building or structure and will be calculated by the Building Official.

1. BUILDING PLANS

Two sets of detailed building plans. If you cannot draw the necessary building or site plans, then you should obtain the services of a qualified person.

Example Floor Plans

- scale not less than 1:50 metric (1/4 inch to 1 foot);
- size and location of windows and doors;
- location of all plumbing fixtures;
- location of all mechanical equipment.
- all rooms, size and use of each;
- all dimensions;
- finished and unfinished areas; —

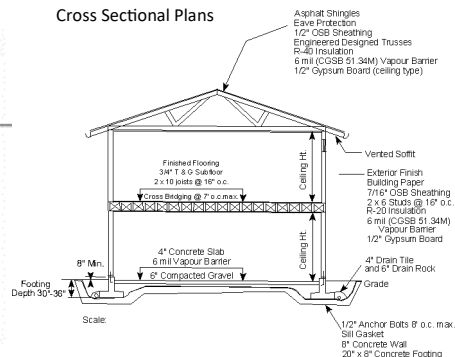

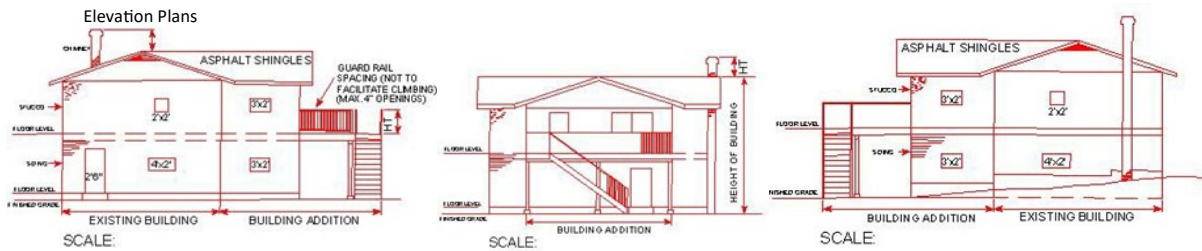

Cross Sectional Plans



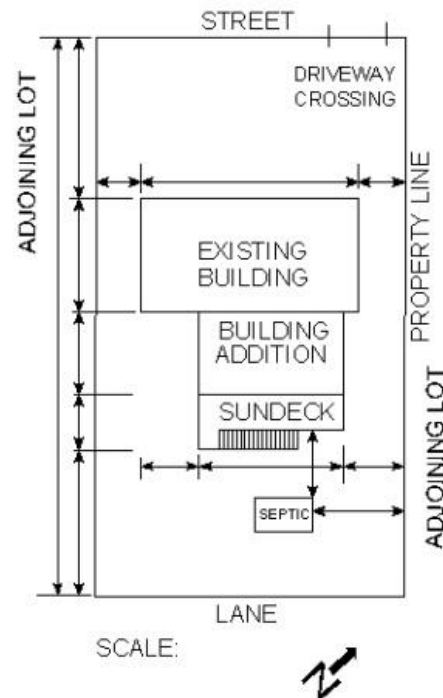

2. SITE PLAN

- full legal description of lot: lot number, plan number; district lot number (from your tax notice or Title);
- lot dimensions;
- adjoining street names;
- locations and uses of existing and proposed buildings or additions;
- distances from all property lines for existing and proposed buildings or additions;
- location of legal road access to the property;
- size, location and number of parking spaces;
- existing and proposed wells or other water sources;
- location of existing or proposed sewage disposal fields on property;
- location of any watercourses on property showing distances from existing or proposed buildings or additions;

This information is intended to assist the general public in applying for a Building Permit within the District of Hudson's Hope.



BUILDING INSPECTIONS (Typical)

The Building Bylaw requires inspections at the following stages of construction;

- Footings - prior to pouring concrete.
- Backfilling - after completion of damp-proofing, drain tile, and drain rock (if required), but prior to backfilling.
- Plumbing - before any part of the plumbing system is covered.
- Framing - after the entire rough-in plumbing, electrical and mechanical equipment is installed and the framing is completed to lockup stage, but prior to insulating.
- Insulation and Vapour Barrier - after all insulation and vapour barriers are installed, but prior to covering.
- Final - when the building or portion thereof is completed and ready for occupancy, but prior to occupancy thereof.

An Occupancy Certificate is required prior to occupancy of a building. In order for an Occupancy Certificate to be issued, all inspections above must be approved.
