

THE DISTRICT OF HUDSON HOPE IS UPDATING THE OFFICIAL COMMUNITY PLAN!

The District is beginning a process to update and review its Official Community Plan (OCP)- an important policy document that guides the future decisions for the District of Hudson's Hope. It has been over 10 years since the Official Community Plan was last updated, and it is time for an update! We want to make sure that the updated Official Community Plan reflects the needs and priorities of the Hudson Hope's residents.

WHAT IS AN OFFICIAL COMMUNITY PLAN?

Every municipality in British Columbia under the *Local Government Act* is required to have an Official Community Plan. An Official Community Plan is a bylaw adopted by the District's Council that acts like a roadmap for the District when considering decisions about the future growth and development of Hudson's Hope. The Official Community Plan will guide decision-making in a way that reflects the community's future vision and how the District will strive to achieve that vision over time. FAQs

Hudson's Hope Official Community Plan

WHAT IS THE OFFICIAL COMMUNITY PLAN?

An Official Community Plan (OCP) is the highest-level policy document for a local government – it informs and guides how the community grows for the next 15+ years. The Official Community Plan is a bylaw adopted by Council that sets out the vision and direction that will guide the future growth and development of the District of Hudson's Hope. It includes policies on the future use and management of lands, as well as such elements as municipal facilities and services, utility and transportation systems, environmental stewardship, economic development, arts, heritage and culture, and social health and wellness to set out a clear path to guide Council, staff and the community.

DOES HUDSON'S HOPE ALREADY HAVE AN OFFICIAL COMMUNITY PLAN?

Yes. The current Official Community Plan was adopted in 2013. Best practice is to review an Official Community Plan every 5-10 years and revising as necessary. The District seeks to provide greater clarity on Official Community Plan policies, and ensure the policies are modern, reflect recent legislative changes, and include studies and plans that the District has undertaken since 2013. All of this makes it a good time to update the Official Community Plan to reflect these changes and better positions Hudson's Hope to achieve its future aspirations. WHO CREATES THE OFFICIAL COMMUNITY PLAN?

Our whole community does. Every person is asked to provide some input: residents, business owners, community groups, First Nations, Métis community, District Council and staff, and government agencies. Ultimately, District Council will adopt an Official Community Plan that they believe best represents the interests and objectives of the community as a whole.

WHY DO WE NEED AN OFFICIAL COMMUNITY PLAN?

The Official Community Plan guides every decision made by Council, keeping in mind what the community has identified as important. The Official Community Plan provides a regulatory framework to guide how the District evaluates and approves future development. It also provides clear direction for how Hudson's Hope should grow in the coming years so that growth is well planned and supports the community's vision for its future.

HOW WILL THE OFFICIAL COMMUNITY PLAN BE DEVELOPED?

An Official Community Plan involves community engagement and input. All of this information is gathered through surveys, public workshops, and conversations with the community in a variety of forms. A draft Official Community Plan will be developed that captures the vision of the community, which will then be presented to Council for their feedback. It then goes back to the community for another round of community engagement. Once the final Official Community Plan is complete it will be referred to external agencies for their comment and work through the bylaw adoption process. Before any Official Community Plan can be adopted by District Council, a public hearing must also be held.

Police Report



The Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to 21 calls for service between September 24th to October 17th. 47 written violations and warning tickets were issued to drivers between the above dates for various motor vehicle related offences. Highway and road safety continues to be a focus for the Hudson's Hope RCMP.

On September 27th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to a report of a threats complainant at a plot of Crown land located along Barkley St. It was confirmed that hunters who, were legally allowed to be hunting in this area, had been confronted and accosted by local residents who are known to police. It was reported that after the hunters were confronted, the suspects left the area on a side x side but within minutes, the hunters started to hear gun shots being fired off into unknown directions. This file has become part of a larger police investigation which is still on-going.

On September 29th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP and BC Conservational Services teamed up and conducted a joint check-stop along Beryl Prairie Rd. Checking motorists for Wildlife Act and Motor Vehicle Act offences, as well as Firearm and Criminal Code offences. During the check-stop, approximately 100 vehicles were stopped, yielding several Wildlife and Motor Vehicle Act offences, including a motorist receiving a 24-hour driving prohibition for being under the influence of drugs.

On October 5th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to a report of a single commercial vehicle accident along the Kobes FSR. It was confirmed that a commercial truck, hauling a fully loaded tanker full of processed water, swerved for a moose that unexpectedly walked into the roadway, resulting in the truck rolling 1.5 times. Luckily for the driver, he was wearing his seatbelt and though the truck itself was torn apart around him during the roll, he came out with non-life-threatening injuries and was transported to hospital.

On October 5th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP were patrolling a local plot of Crown land along Barkley St. which has been an area of contention for several police incidents over the past few months. While patrolling this area, police located several homemade tire deflation devices, ie: metal plates with large spikes welded to the base, at the entrance to this plot of land. Based on the severe public safety risk of these devices, all these items were seized and removed. This file remains open for further investigation. Police are advising the public to be aware and vigilant for these and other booby traps in this area, as it is often frequented frequented by the public.

On October 10th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP and ERT members, executed a search warrant on a residence located on Barkley St. From the search warrant, police located and seized several illegally possessed firearms, along with a stolen firearm. Four individuals have been charged with multiple charges and this file is now before the courts.

On October 11th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP conducted a road-side stop with a known suspect vehicle which has been referenced to drug trafficking. Upon approaching the vehicle, police located a known male within the vehicle who was arrestable for several Criminal Code offences, pending from a related police file. This individual became actively resistant with the police officer, therefore was taken to the ground quickly and arrested. The driver was also identified and arrested for breaching his conditions. Charges have been sought and this file is now before the courts.

On October 15th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP solved the file involving the suspicious death of a beloved family cat, which occurred on September 5th, 2023. Based on acquiring a full confession from a local resident, charges of Mischief and Causing Unnecessary Suffering to an Animal are being sought via way of a Summons. This file is now before the courts.

On October 16th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to a single motor vehicle accident along the Beryl Prairie Rd. Upon the investigation, police located the driver who was found to be uninjured but was believed to be under the influence of alcohol and police later confirmed this driver to be two and a half times over the legal limit. The driver was charged for impaired driving and this file is before the courts. During the investigation, it was noted by the driver, that the cause of the accident was due to a sasquatch forcing the truck off the road and later it angrily shook the truck prior to running off into the woods upon police arriving on scene.

If anyone observes this sasquatch, do not attempt to make contact with it nor try to get a selfie with said hairy beast, and be aware that this creature does not like white pick-up trucks!







Baby Program Interest: If we get enough interest in a baby time program, we will be starting one up! Please do not hesitate to reach out so that we can try to schedule something that works for you!


